**A CONVERT SHARES HER LOVE FOR THE CATHOLIC FAITH**

It has been a year and a half since my spiritual world was flipped on its head and I became Catholic.

I've had a strong relationship with God my entire life. I have journeyed through many Christian denominations over the years, most recently as an active member of a Presbyterian church. So, when I received the Sacraments of Confirmation and Holy Communion last Easter, I wouldn't say that I was re-saved; rather, I would say that



the relationship I already had with Christ was deepened.

In the past, going to church on Sunday morning was just a routine event, an obligatory act that felt like something I was supposed to do. Now I crave it, and I can't wait for it, and that's mainly because of one thing - *the Eucharist*. I realized at my Confirmation that that's what had been missing from my spiritual life!

As we begin the Liturgy of the Eucharist each Mass, it becomes for me such an honor to kneel as we humble ourselves before the Lord. There are no words to adequately describe what the Eucharist means for me. Having spent all my life as a Protestant, I can honestly tell you that treating communion as a symbol is definitely not the same as the real presence of Christ in the



Eucharist.

I had no idea previously of the beauty and richness of the Church. Since becoming Catholic, I look at things differently. I see people differently. I see nature differently. And I most definitely see "church" differently. I struggle with trying to explain the peace that comes with being a part of the Catholic Church. I know why people who convert to Catholicism use that cliché "coming home." It's because it fits so well. I know that sounds all mushy, fluffy and canned, but that's exactly what it feels like. *It's an enrichment of the soul, a fulfillment of a search, the completion of a journey.*

There was always some missing piece in every church my husband and I attended. There was something that just didn't feel quite right and created doubt somewhere inside that we could not shake off. I've found doubt can be a great friend. It pushes you to search and find truth. And after all this time I've not had a single doubt that I made the right choice. All the pieces are now there, fitting together perfectly. And that last piece was the beauty and fullness of the Catholic Faith and most of all – the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. I now understand fully why Jesus used the words He did when He instituted the Last Supper. You know He's there. You can feel Him. And you don't forget it.

**RCIA & CONDENSED RCIA AT ST. PETER'S**

## PRESERVING OUR PAST, SECURING OUR FUTURE CAPITAL CAMPAIGN



These are the new hot water boilers which now provide heat inside the church.

Thanks to the generosity of our parishioners, the *Preserving our Past, Securing Our Future* Capital Campaign has moved us closer to the target.

As of December 1, 2016, the campaign has generated 2,508,965 in pledges, which is only \$491,035 from our overall \$3,000,000 goal. We have received \$1,119,839 in campaign payments, which has allowed us to move forward on several projects.

Three of the projects in our plan have moved forward.

**Church Boiler Project** — This project included the installation of a new hot-water boiler system for the church. This new dedicated system will provide better control and system efficiency that could result in cost savings to the parish of as much as \$7,000 annually in heating costs. This project is under budget in part of a \$62,500 energy efficiency grant from Columbia Gas.

As part of this project, the church basement is getting a facelift. The basement was "cleaned out" — a couple dumpsters full of items that had not been used in years or decades. The brick walls have been painted a new brighter color, new ceiling tiles have been installed, and the entire basement and kitchen has been commercially cleaned.

Money raised during the Fall Gala are funding a new commercial freezer, tables and chairs.

**Sound System Improvements** — The parish hired a consultant to complete a sound study of the Sanctuary, and look for ways that the parish could incorporate video recording and displays. This study has been completed and is currently in the bid process. It is our hope to have the new sound system installed by Easter 2017. Estimated costs for this project are \$150,000.

**Security System Improvements** — The parish has completed the addition of a significant upgrade to our security system on campus, including new fencing at Montessori House, several new security cameras, new door

locks and key fob entry systems. All of these projects are completed at a budgeted figure of \$68,500.

These initial projects were directed to some our more immediate needs, and we are pleased so far with progress on this work. Attention now turns to the planning the work inside the church. This includes three major areas:

- **Sanctuary**—Repairs and painting of the walls and ceiling, replacement of the original wood floor and refurbishment of the pews.  
*Estimated Cost: \$925,000*
- **Organ Restoration**—includes a full refurbishing of the organ console and a full cleaning of the pipes along with any necessary repairs.  
*Estimated Cost \$250,000*
- **Stained Glass Windows**—A full evaluation of all the stained glass windows and restoration of windows already identified as structurally deficient.  
*Estimated Cost: \$200,000*

As you might expect these three projects will need to be planned together as there may be efficiencies in combining some of this work. We will also need to plan for continuation of the use of the sanctuary or possible relocation to another location during this major part of the project.

After work is completed in the church, our attention will turn to the High School auditorium and Bob Frye Gymnasium. Estimates for this project are currently around \$900,000 and we will need to meet our challenge goal of \$3 million, with cash in hand, for this project to move forward.
