Over spring break, I had the opportunity to attend the National Catholic Education Conference in St. Louis. I was one of more than 8,000 Catholic educators and administrators in attendance. It was an overwhelming sight to see so many people dedicated to the mission of Catholic Education.

The biggest takeaway is that Catholic education is alive and well. Schools across the country are finding ways to survive and thrive in the 21st century. Most of my focus was on sessions dealing with advancement, governance and school choice.

There are some great models for us to look at on how to grow our school, and to add emphasis to our Catholic Identity and how we, as a deanery, can do more to share resources to keep all our area Catholic elementary schools viable.

One school has embraced Christ's words in Luke's gospel. Christ told Simon to, "...Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch." Simon said in reply, "Master we have worked hard all night and have caught nothing, but at your command, I will lower the nets." When they had done this, they caught a great number of fish... (Luke 5:4-6)

Going out to fish in deeper water takes a bigger risk, but it can reap bigger rewards. That is what our parish and school need to do over the next couple of years. We need to put together a plan that puts our boat out into deeper water: to be willing to take a risk, to do the hard work needed to put our school on a long-term path to success.

Another piece of that puzzle is School Choice. There is currently a new piece of legislation sponsored by State Senator Matt Huffman that will expand quality education choice to a new level in the State of Ohio. If passed, any student who **is not currently enrolled** in a private school and has a family income below 400% of the federal poverty guidelines will be eligible to apply for this scholarship. (*This means a family of four who makes less than \$97,200 would be eligible to apply.*)

These scholarships would be worth up to \$5,000 for K-8 & \$7,500 for 9-12 for families at or below 200% of the federal poverty level. The rest would qualify for a \$2,500/\$3,750 scholarship.

St. Peter's School will be hosting an informational meeting on the proposed school choice legislation on Wednesday, May 10th at 7 p.m. in the High School Auditorium. Senator Huffman will be here to provide additional information and hear your feedback on the proposal.

Our ultimate goal is to make these school choice scholarships available to all families, including families who already sacrifice to send their children to schools like St. Peter's.

Finally, I want just to remind everyone that there are several public school renewal levies on the upcoming May ballot. While a faith-based education is important for many families, we still need to have quality public school systems. Public education is important for the future of our community. An educated workforce will help us to bring new jobs to our local economy.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION



Some monks and nuns trace their community origins back a thousand years or so, before it became customary to reserve the Blessed Sacrament in tabernacles. In their rules of life, which evolved from the lifestyle and prayer of their predecessors, the core experience of Christ's presence is at the altar itself, and in the symbol of assembly for prayer. To this day, when the monks or nuns file into their church in procession, they march two by two, and then bow profoundly to the altar before turning and bowing in reverence toward the brother or sister at their side. It is probably more difficult, in practice, to revere the presence of Christ in a person who irks you by taking the car keys, shirking a work duty, or burning the toast!

We can trace in these religious orders' enduring customs the ancient appreciation for the altar as the center of the church building, and of the community of the faithful as the Body of Christ. Usually, a monastery today will reserve the Blessed Sacrament in some quiet corner of the monastic church, in a fairly small space, more suitable for private prayer than for the gathering of the whole community. In a cloister, the architecture may allow the public limited access to this space. Liturgical law tells us, in both monasteries and parish churches, that there is no need for more than a few hosts in the place of reservation, just enough for viaticum, the "food for the journey" that is the final sacramental celebration for a dying Christian.
