The school offices are officially open and we are getting ready for a dynamic academic year. I am looking forward to all the new things happening!

First, I am excited to work with the new High School Principal, Ms. Tammy Haus. I think we will make a great team. I would also like to announce that Mrs. Ashley Rastorfer is the new Assistant Principal alongside me at the elementary level. She will continue on as Director of Montessori. I will also be responsible for the special education program at St. Peter's, grades K-12. Welcome to the two new administrators. It will be a new challenge for all of us, however, we are a strong group of gals!

On the horizon we are putting into the elementary schedule new classes called 'Blended' classrooms. This is where students from two grade levels are combined into one class. This is a formal education program in which students control time, place, path and pace with teacher direction. This classroom will utilize many different activities throughout the day. Advanced students can be easily more challenged with higher level materials and more peer interaction and struggling students can stay longer on material they are having difficulty with. (Very similar to the Montessori concept of learning and exploration). Students in "Blended" classrooms tend to take greater responsibility for their learning. The conception of blended classrooms is universal-being done all over the world! (We still have one class each of the traditional classrooms). We realize one shoe doesn't fit everyone.

I am excited to start the new school year. There are many new plans, great teachers, educational aides and, hopefully, excited students. Remember — Open House is Friday, August 18, from 3-6 p.m. Students and parents can come, meet their teachers and bring their school supplies in. I'm looking forward to seeing everyone.
