## THE CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD Sunday, November 19

9:30 am Abby 11:30 am Heather On Sunday, November 26, we will have our annual Eucharistic Adoration Sunday, on the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Following the 11:30 am Mass, the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed throughout the afternoon for private prayer and will conclude at 5:30 pm with Evening Prayer and Benediction.

The Eucharistic presence of our Lord and Savior continues to sustain our lives as Catholics. I hope that you will sacrifice a little of your precious time to be with us for adoration at some time during the afternoon. Since this is our Centenary Year, I think it an appropriate time to ask for representatives and various ministers of our parish to "sign up for a time" to pray – for our parish and our parishioners; for our youth; for our elderly and those who live alone; for our married couples and those preparing for marriage; and those who are single; for our sick and those suffering from disease; for vocations to the priesthood, diaconate and religious life; for our school; for those participating in religious education; and for those who are in need of healing. I'm sure you, too, have particular intentions to bring before our Lord! "Come to me, all you who are burdened, and I will refresh you!"

I ask, in a particular way, that you pray for those who minister in our parish - we priests and deacons; our parish staff; our school administrators, teachers and religious educators; and those employed by our parish to facilitate our day to day life here. It is all for the love of God!

St. John Paul II stated in his encyclical, "On the Eucharist," – "It is pleasant to spend time with him, to lie close to his breast like the Beloved Disciple (Jn. 13:25) and to feel the infinite love present in his heart. If in our time Christians must be distinguished above all by the 'art of prayer,' how can we not feel a renewed need to spend time in spiritual converse, in silent adoration, in heartfelt love before Christ present in the Most Holy Sacrament?" St. John Paul II continues, "This practice, repeatedly praised and recommended by the Magisterium, is supported by the example of many saints. Particularly outstanding in this regard was Saint Alphonsus Ligouri, who wrote, 'Of all devotions, that of adoring Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament is the greatest after the sacraments, the one dearest to God and the one most helpful to us.' The Eucharist is a priceless treasure: by not only celebrating it but also by praying before it outside of Mass we are enabled to make contact with the very wellspring of grace (no. 25)."

This focused time of renewal will also be of great benefit to us all – to individuals, families, adults, children and our parish at large. There are many needs that we can bring before Christ, and lay them at His feet, in humble reparation and worship. Don't let this time pass without a visit, however brief it must
