Fr. Gregory Hite and Fr. Austin will read the Gospel in Italian at the Masses they celebrate.

Pentecost (from the Greek word, pentēkostē) means fiftieth, and originates as a seven week Jewish harvest festival following the Passover Sabbath. It predates the time of Christ. Also called the Feast of Weeks, it eventually became a memorial of the covenant and of the giving of the Law. Early Christians continued a similar observance but emphasized the Resurrection. Fasting and kneeling were not allowed during this period as it was designated as a time of rejoicing. In its nascent stages, the Church celebrated the Ascension and Pentecost together as this feast of the fiftieth day evolved. In the late 4th century, Christians began to observe the feast of the Ascension on the fortieth day after Easter and, Pentecost, the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, ten days later. In the U.S. we celebrate the Ascension on the seventh Sunday of Easter and Pentecost, "the birthday of the Church," a week later.
