Now that the year is over and the summer months are upon us, I have had time to review end of year testing. I would like to share some of the results. I do know there is always room for improvement.

The 5th grade students take a yearly Diocesan mandated religion test know as ACRE. The class average score in part one-Faith Knowledge- was 73.9%. That includes all students, Catholic and non-Catholic. (The national average was 69.4%.) We also scored above the national average in all of part one's sub domains. On the second portion of the test-4 Pillars- again we scored above the national average in all sections. Congratulations to students and to their teacher, Mrs. Finnen.

All required 3rd grade students passed the State reading test. This test is required by the Ohio Department of Education to move on to the 4th grade. Amen.

Our MAP testing is required by the Diocese to be given 2 or 3 times a year. I will report on the Spring results.

Grade 2-70% of the students scored average to high average in math and 76% scored average to high average in reading.

Grade 3-50% of the students scored average to high average in math and 80% scored average to high average in reading. In science 74% of the students scored average to high average.

Grade 4-59% of the students scored average to high average in math and 71% scored average to high average in reading. In science 78% of the students scored average to high average.

Grade 5-45% of the students scored average to high average in math and 81% scored average to high average in reading. In science 81% scored average to high average.

Grade 6-50% of the students scored average to high average in math and 78% scored average to high average in reading. In science 73% scored average to high average.

Great reading scores...... however, we have some work to do in math. Our teachers adopted a new math series titled *GO Math*. That will be implemented in the fall this 2018-19 school year.

I hope everyone is enjoying a great summer. Relax, enjoy quality family time and keep safe.

For the first time in many years, we have exceeded our Annual Fund goal! CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

On June 18 the installation of the scaffolding necessary for the work in the church seating area was started and should be completed by early next week at the latest. The painters have returned and should have the stairway to the choir loft completed. This will complete all painting outside of the church seating area. The next visible activity will be the removal



of some of the damaged sections of the stained glass windows and the removal of the Stations for cleaning and to accommodate the painting.

By this following week the cleaning of the ceiling and flat surfaces will begin to allow for the painting to begin soon. During this next part of the project most of the ceiling area will be hidden from view as the wood "dance floor" will extend from the altar rail in the front to over the choir loft at the rear of the church. We will make sure we have adequate lighting under this platform during this next phase as some of the lights will not extend to below the platform. As this phase of the work progresses please be sure to use caution when walking in the church. All Masses will continue to be held as usual in our church during this final phase of this restoration project.

175TH ANNIVERSARY NOTES

We have to marvel at the extraordinary young priests who served as the first few resident pastors of St. Peter's Parish. Fathers Joseph Gallagher, James Maloney, and Jacob Kuhn were all quite young when assigned to our parish. Having been fairly recently ordained, these young men could hardly have been faulted if they balked at such a responsibility.

Father Gallagher served Mansfield while simultaneously serving Crestline and Shelby Settlement and raising money to build a church in Loudonville. Father Maloney bought land to build a rectory on the site of our present elementary school. He also bought land to begin a Catholic cemetery in Mansfield, where before that time deceased Catholics had to be buried in the cemetery at Shelby Settlement. Father Kuhn undertook to start our school in 1868. (We are proud to be celebrating the 150th anniversary of St. Peter's School this fall!) What commitment and faith these priests had to have in order to come into this fledgling community and start to build our family of faith!

CALLED BY GOD

Today's scriptures invite us to listen to two calls. The first is the call issued by the LORD to the prophet Amos, the "shepherd and a dresser of sycamores" (Amos 7:14). The second is the call the Lord Jesus issued to the Twelve, whom he sent out "two by two" (Mark 6:7). These faithful people responded to the call, prophesying and preaching to the people to whom they had been sent. Each of us received a call when we were baptized. The second reading invites us to ponder that call as we are reminded that we are chosen in Christ and that, in love, God "destined us for adoption" (Ephesians 1:5). As adopted daughters and sons of God we are called to bring the presence of Christ into our marriages, families, schools, and places of work. Let us be inspired today to say yes to the call we hear once again through God's living word.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

At the time of the Reformation, although England broke away from papal authority under Henry VIII, a silent majority clung to the Catholic faith. Henry's eldest daughter, Mary, restored the "old religion" in a fierce persecution of Protestants (she is called "Bloody Mary" for good reason.) His youngest daughter, Elizabeth, rejected papal ties. Under her reign, beginning with legislation in 1593, Catholics were persecuted again, and only the very wealthy could afford the fines for not attending Anglican services on Sunday. They were called "recusants," from a Latin word meaning "refuse," since they refused to attend the liturgy of the Church of England. Many families maintained Catholic tradition in secret, and today their descendants claim "Recusancy" as a mark of family pride. For generations they sent their young people abroad to be educated in convents and monasteries. It is not surprising that the first monastery in colonial America springs from Holland with the daughters of patrician English recusant families. Port Tobacco, Maryland, proved fruitful soil for the Carmelite tradition.
