Dear Friends in Christ,

Last weekend, we had a respite from the scaffolding in church. By the time you read this week's bulletin, the scaffolding for Phase II of our church restoration will be underway. It will create inconvenience in seating, but the "silver lining" in having to "crunch together" will be a greater sense of community. Introduce yourself to your neighbor! The temporary inconvenience will yield a more beautiful house of worship for all of us.

I wish to reiterate what Dave Barber, our chair for the restoration, stated at last weekend's liturgies. Capital Campaign commitments are *restricted for their express purpose* – in this case, for our church restoration and refurbishing for the high school auditorium. **We cannot use these funds for our ordinary, daily operating expenses.** Therefore, I humbly ask for your continued weekly support for our daily expenses (offertory) which include our customary bills to keep the entire plant going, as well as for compensation and benefits for our dedicated 130 employees. Your sacrificial giving is necessary to secure for them the "just pay for the faithful steward." It is a matter of justice.

Finally, I came across an article the other day one of our former teachers in the high school gave me – back in 2011. The themes are still applicable today. I offer them here, even though I know I'm "preaching to the choir" (so to speak). I give credit to Terry Pluto, who wrote this article in the Cleveland Plain Dealer on August 27, 2011.

"I go to church nearly every Sunday, whether I'm at home or on the road. If I can't go on Sunday, I try to find a Saturday night service somewhere. Some people say, 'I can be close to God walking the woods or quietly spending an hour in my chair reading the Bible and praying.'

"That may be true, but how many of us actually take the time to do that? Most of us skip church because we don't feel like going. We think the pastor is boring, the people are phonies, and we're tired.

"If we are serious about faith, we should be at a place where others share the same interests. 80% of people identify themselves as Christian, but only about 47% regularly attend church. More revealing, 31% admitted that they had not been to church in the past six months unless it was a wedding or a funeral.

"Among people who said they were Catholics, weekly attendance is 49%. For "born again" Christians, it was 59 percent. For those in the general Protestant category, it was under 50%.

"Of course, there are times when everyone misses church for a very good reason. *But to grow in faith, church is essential.*" [Emphasis mine.]

[Here at St. Peter's, we estimate that we have 1630 families – registered. If we were to follow the average, about 30 - 33% worship regularly.]

The author continues, "I need someone reminding me about the dangers of gossip, about the need to be more patient with others around me. I know these things but still need to hear them – along with so much more.

"And a good church or any other house of worship (notice that I didn't say 'a perfect church' or 'house of worship') is a place for that, and more. But we have to ask ourselves if we are willing to make the effort to find one."

Enjoy your summer, spend time with your family, and remember to pray together. May God bless you in every way. And, don't forget to count your blessings!!

ST. **PARISH** PETER'S WAS **OFFICIALLY** ESTABLISHED OR FOUNDED IN 1844.

For many years before that, the spiritual needs of the Catholics of Mansfield were met by travelling priests assigned by the Bishop of Cincinnati. Those travelling priests, (possibly including St. John Nepomucene Neumann C.Ss.R. who became the 4th Bishop of Philadelphia and was canonized by Blessed Pope Paul VI in 1977), were the stuff of legend as they wandered the everexpanding wilderness of the "West." Many of them went on to become the bishops and leaders of the young and hungry Church in the United States in the early part of the 19th century.

We do not know the precise date of our founding, but we do know that the year was 1844 and that the time of year was autumn. Bishop Purcell, in discussions with his priests, had originally settled on naming the new parish in Mansfield for the Holy Trinity. It is not clear how the Bishop's mind was changed so that we became St. Peter's Parish instead Holy Trinity Parish.

So it's been nearly 175 years since our Parish was founded and we need to begin planning for the celebration of that anniversary. With that in mind, we will be forming a committee to plan the celebrations that will take place between May and October of 2019. Volunteers are needed to help with the many plans and projects of such a committee. 175TH ANNIVERSARY NOTES

Prior to the founding of St. Peter's in the fall of 1844, the City of Mansfield was part of the Mission territory of the Church in Ohio. Priests from as far away as Cincinnati as well as from Shelby Settlement, Norwalk, Wooster, Loudonville, Canton, and even from Pennsylvania would visit Mansfield occasionally to provide the sacraments, religious instruction, and spiritual comfort to the Catholics here. If you're thinking this just involved getting on the highway, think again. Roads were rough, frequently overgrown and often impassable. The first Bishop of Cincinnati (and of all of Ohio for that matter) was the Dominican Edward D. Fenwick. On one of his mission journeys to Northern Ohio in 1832 he visited Mansfield before heading to Wooster. His itinerary called for him to go to Loudonville from Wooster, but the Mohican River was flooded so badly when he attempted to cross that he had to return to Wooster. While there he contracted cholera and died. He was buried at Wooster for more than a year before his body was removed to Cincinnati for burial.
