3. Follow God's will without condition, that is, freely.

Ignatius says that any process of spiritual direction and understanding ought to begin with total freedom, that is, a willingness to follow God's will, whatever it is."

Lastly, I would like to close with a prayer,

"God of all time, help us enter the New Year quietly, thoughtful of who we are to ourselves and to others, mindful that our steps make an impact and our words carry power.

May we walk gently. May we speak only after we have listened well. Creator of all life, help us enter the New Year reverently, aware that you have endowed every creature and plant, every person and habitat with beauty and purpose. May we regard the world with tenderness. May we honor rather than destroy. Lover of all souls, help us enter the New Year joyfully, willing to laugh and dance and dream, remembering our many gifts with thanks and looking forward to blessings yet to come.

May the grace and peace of Christ bless you now and in the days ahead."

You will not need to call and request a tax statement.

END OF YEAR CHARITABLE GIFTS

The end of the year is fast approaching, and with all of this year's changes to the tax code this year, you might find yourself in a position to make an end of year charitable gift to reduce your 2018 taxable burden. You may want to make a gift to St. Peter's to: pay off your Capital Campaign pledge early, pre-pay your 2019 Sunday collection, the Annual Fund or endow a sustaining gift to the Msgr. Edward C. Dunn Foundation.

Anyone may give the gift of cash or stock to St. Peter's. Gifts of stock that have been held for a year or longer can have a charitable deduction for the stock's fair market value on the day it is donated, and you may avoid paying capital gains on the stock. Stock transfers should be initiated by December 22, 2018 to guarantee they will be completed by the end of 2018. All other gifts must be postmarked by December 31, 2018 to be credited towards your 2018 giving cycle.

If you are 70 1/2 years or older, you may also elect to make a qualified charitable distribution from your IRA. Be sure to consult your tax advisor about any questions on how the new tax laws affect your personal situation.

HANDICAP SEATING IN CHURCH

In the restoration of the church, we have retained the original handicap seating: 2 rows located on the Blessed Virgin side (closest to the south parking lot). We have also attempted to make accommodations for wheel chair areas in the center portion of the church, again the Blessed Virgin side. Eventually, all these areas will be designated by cushions. Holy Communion will be brought to both areas on weekends. However, note: the "break" in the middle of the church on both sides of the main aisle is not designated as a handicap area. Worshipers who choose to sit in these pews are asked to process forward for Holy Communion as usual.

175TH ANNIVERSARY NOTES

We continue our look at the Pastorate of Monsignor Rupert Goebel, seventh Pastor of St. Peter's. In the last column we ended with the celebration of Monsignor Goebel's 25th anniversary as the Pastor of St. Peter's.

The late 1940's and early to mid-1950's saw the continuation and the expansion of Monsignor Goebel's efforts to raise money for the construction of a grand new St. Peter's High School. Preliminary architectural plans had been drawn by an architectural design firm from Pittsburgh. Promotional and fundraising materials were drawn up and distributed in abundance. The response of the parishioners and friends of St. Peter's was steady and generous.

Sadly, Monsignor Goebel would not live to see the fulfillment of his vision. In late 1954 at Thanksgiving and in early 1955, Monsignor developed stomach cancer. On February 11, 1955 he was hospitalized for surgery, even though he and his doctors already knew that his condition was terminal. The surgery was only nominally successful and Monsignor Goebel remained hospitalized at Mansfield General Hospital from then onward.

A second surgery was attempted in March but had little chance of success. His condition worsening, Monsignor Goebel set about providing an example of faith-filled endurance and fortitude in the face of suffering. From the beginning of April, Monsignor Goebel was partially comatose most of the time as he grew steadily weaker. His last words, spoken to a relative at his bedside six days before he died, were, "God bless you."

Saturday May 14, 1955, shortly before 2 PM, Monsignor Rupert Charles Goebel died after a nearly six month long battle with cancer. His funeral liturgy was celebrated at St. Peter's by Toledo Bishop George Rehring and hundreds of clergy from the Diocese and from areas near Mansfield. The church was draped in black and a steady stream of parishioners, family and friends of the Monsignor walked past the bier on which he was laid out in the church prior to the funeral Mass. The solemn Pontifical High Requiem Mass was offered and attended by nearly a thousand people including many of Mansfield's prominent citizens and community leaders.

Monsignor Goebel was buried in his family plot in the cemetery at Edgerton, Ohio. Father James O'Grady was named acting Pastor until a permanent Pastor could be appointed for St. Peter's.

Many of our senior and long-time members have extensive and lively memories of Monsignor Goebel. They recall him as simultaneously strict and stern while also being zealous for the Church and the parish. He was known for his requirement that all students of the school and as many parishioners as possible would recite Compline in front of the Blessed Sacrament on Sunday afternoons.

The late Robert Kasper, a life-long parishioner and altar server at St. Peter's, recalled that Monsignor Goebel would drill all the altar servers and all the prospective altar servers in their Latin responses to be recited during Mass. Monsignor was also known around Mansfield as the "radio priest" because of the many radio commentaries and broadcasts he offered on the air at WMAN. It was Monsignor Goebel who instituted the May Crowning service which still takes place every spring at St. Peter's. He is recalled by all as a force to be reckoned with and was widely respected by the entire community. That he is still recalled today is an indicator of the impact he had during his time as our longest serving Pastor.




