Nothing gives me greater joy than to hear that my children are walking in the truth. – 3 John 1:4

This summer we had many children walking in the truth. Over 100 of them actually and they took time out of their summer schedule to spend time with their faith.

In June we took about 25 young people to Steubenville. Steubenville is a three day youth conference that is dedicated to helping young people see the place that Christ holds in their daily existence, and how to rely on Christ to get them through life. This year's theme was "Belong" based on the scriptural passage, "See what love the Father has bestowed on us, that we may be called children of God." (1 John 3: 1) and that was a lesson well learned! The conference we attended had more young people participating in the Sacrament of Reconciliation than any other youth conference hosted at that site since its inception, and young people participating in that Reconciliation is not only notable but amazing!

The following weekend youth attended YES or Youth Elect Service. This was an opportunity to put that faith into action and help homeowners who through illness or otherwise were not able to take care of some of their home's needs on their own. Eighteen youth went to 21 houses which is amazing in and of itself, but for our high school students to dedicate an entire weekend to helping others is nothing less than outstanding.

Two short weeks later, we had over 50 very young disciples and 20 high school and junior high youth along with some amazing adult helpers participate in our Vacation Bible School. This is a four day program and this year's theme was "Mysteries of the Faith" where they explored the Blessed Trinity, the Indelible Mark, the Resurrection and the mystery of God's forgiveness through absolution! They played hard, they prayed hard, they danced hard, and in the end the beauty of the entire week was seeing such young people raising the expectation of their faith through their joy in learning about it and participating!

We hope that all of our children walk in the truth. We pray that one day they all aspire to be the epitome of truth. Programs such as Steubenville, YES, Vacation Bible School and many other youth programs available through the parish throughout the year are tools to help them know what the truth is and to seek it. We would love to see more young people be involved in these programs, because there is no telling how high they can soar with their faith until we give them the means to know about it and act on it. Religious education, such as through Saint Peter's School or our PSR program, is definitely a step in the right direction. Youth programming helps the youth to experience their faith in a whole new way!

#### 175TH ANNIVERSARY NOTES

In the past few columns on our Parish's 175<sup>th</sup> Anniversary we have been considering the pastorate of our ninth Pastor, Monsignor Edward C. Dunn, who served from 1969 to 1984. As we have previously noted, Msgr. Dunn's tenure here marked some of the most challenging and growth-filled years in our Parish history.

In order to help understand Msgr. Dunn's lasting impact on our Parish, I have asked some parishioners to share their memories of him with me as I write these columns. St. Peter's Religion Teacher and Liturgy Assistant, Angie Dillon, shared some thoughts with me and I would like to share those with you in this column.

"Msgr. Dunn was very focused on implementing the changes dictated by the Second Vatican Council. He offered classes explaining the parts of the Mass and the changes we would see. He wanted to make sure the parishioners were educated in the changes."

"Msgr. Dunn encouraged women to get involved in various ministries in the Church, such as lectors, Communion ministers, Parish servers, Parish Council, and Liturgy Committee."

"The Folk Group was begun during Msgr. Dunn's time, with the help of Fr. Robert Thomas, Fr. Ted Miller, and Fr. Herb Ritchie. Young people in the school and Parish provided more contemporary music, adding guitars, piano and percussion at one Mass each Sunday morning."

"Msgr. Dunn was always visible at School and Parish events. He cheered on the Spartan Basketball teams, visited with students in the school, and attended the Festival, to name only a few examples of his support."

"Msgr. Dunn had great faith that the financial health of the Parish was in the hands of God. Sometimes, when money was tight just before a pay period for School and Parish staff, he would pray fervently that God would provide. Invariably, the Parish would receive a donation or a bequest and everything was fine for another month."

"Msgr. Dunn would visit sick parishioners, often walking from St. Peter's to Mansfield General Hospital, to anoint and bring Communion to the sick. He often attended celebrations in the homes of Parishioners for anniversaries, birthdays, and graduations."

#### **ASKING FOR HELP**

The Beatitudes praise the poor in spirit. One characteristic of those who are poor in spirit is their ability to ask for help; they know when others can provide what they lack. Todays readings encourage us to practice poverty in spirit by asking God for what we need. What could be more natural than to ask God for good things? God is, after all, the inventor of goodness and the giver of all good things. Asking God for help puts us in conversation with God. These conversations take many forms. The reading from Genesis shows Abraham bantering with God like a skilled negotiator, while Saint Paul's letter to the Colossians praises God for answering us even when we don't deserve it. In Saint Luke's Gospel, Jesus not only gives us words to use in our conversations with God (the Our Father), but also promises that God always listens to our prayers.

#### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The pilgrim experience of going by foot to Santiago de Compostella, the shrine of St. James, reached its high point this week at the feast of the Apostle, with tens of thousands of pilgrims on the road. Typically, they cover twelve to twenty miles a day through rough territory. The difficult journey and the often primitive lodging facilities are made bearable by the joy of the pilgrims, their songs and prayers. When their journey is documented properly, they receive the scallop shell, a reminder not only of James the fisherman, but also his call to fish for human beings and to baptize the nations. In the Middle Ages, those who wore this badge on their hats were granted lodging and hospitality wherever they went. Next to the palm, the sign of a Jerusalem pilgrim, the scallop shell was most highly prized. In the Middle Ages, some people so enjoyed the pilgrim road, although it was filled with discomfort and danger, that they spent most of their lives on the road. Today, some people take up the route for exercise, but are drawn gradually into the spirituality of the journey. As you make your summer travels, always fold in an element of pilgrimage: a long walk through beautiful countryside, a visit to a church, a prayer of gratitude for your journey through life's hills and valleys.
