

**THE CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD****October 13**

We're off to a new and exciting school year! One of the new initiatives that the elementary school has adopted is PBS (positive behavior support). PBS is an approach to creating a safe and productive learning environment where teachers can teach and all students can learn. Our theme is "Be a Spartan" and we have set expectations in the classroom, in the hallway, in the cafeteria, on the playground, in the bathroom, and for Mass. The students are rewarded with "Spartan Bucks" for following the set expectations and have opportunities to purchase items from the "Spartan Store" using the "Spartan Bucks" they have earned.

Both the Elementary and High School will begin a new accreditation cycle with OCSAA this year. OCSAA stands for Ohio Catholic Schools Accreditation Association. The purpose of the OCSAA is to strengthen Catholic school identity and mission and to engage Catholic schools in the ongoing improvement of student learning. The accreditation process is a 6 year cycle. Parent, staff, and student surveys have been completed. Survey data will be analyzed and we will use this data, as well as testing results, to create our new Catholic identity and academic goals.

In the coming months, and as a result of the generous donations from some St. Peter's School families, the schoolhouse exhibit at Little Buckeye Museum will become the St. Peter's School "schoolhouse exhibit". More information will be forthcoming. We are very excited about this opportunity!

As always, please feel free to stop in or make an appointment! My door is always open!

## 175<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY NOTES

We continue our recollection of the pastorate of Father Herb Weber, eleventh Pastor of St. Peter's (1994-2005). We are grateful to our Pastoral Associate Lynne Lukach for her work in writing this column and last week's column as well.

The core Pastoral Staff remained quite consistent during Father Herb's eleven years at St. Peter's, with Precious Blood Sister Angeline Hoffman serving as Pastoral Associate, Sandy Lauer as Director of Religious Education, Neil Kraft as Music Director/Organist until 2004, (Current Music Director Bill Johnson took over in 2004), and Colleen O'Leary and Jeremy Secrist for periods of time as Youth Ministers. High School Principals during those years were Father Richard Kennedy and Tressa Reith; Elementary School Principal was James Smith, Montessori Director was Tina Siegfried, and Judy Wiparina was Director of the St. Peter's Child Care program. Father Herb was also assisted by Permanent Deacons Terry Philpott, Jim Marshall, and Larry Wilson.

St. Peter's Parish, with its size, schools, and variety of ministries, has always been "fertile ground" for the development and continuing formation of associate pastors and seminarians. Over Father Herb's eleven years the following priests served as associates here: Father Joseph Szybka, Father James Halleron, Father Michael Brown, Father Daniel Fraser, Father Tony Vera, Father Michael Zacharias, and Father John Brennen. Seminarian interns included Randy Giesige and Tim Ferris, among others.

Father Herb believed strongly in the formation of lay leadership and encouraged parishioners to avail themselves of opportunities for continuing education provided through the Diocesan Lay Ministry Formation program available at that time. He also encouraged parishioners to become involved in a variety of parish activities and ministries, including much emphasis placed on Small Faith Groups and Adult Retreats.

Along with many parishes throughout the Diocese, our parish, under the leadership and enthusiasm of Father Herb, prepared for "Renew 2000," a "pastoral response for the 21<sup>st</sup> century." The goal was to form as many small groups as possible to begin in the fall of 1998, with most groups to meet in parishioners' homes. The format, using provided materials, involved reading the upcoming Sunday Scriptures for each week, sharing faith, and spending time in fellowship. Father called together a team of parishioners months in advance and worked diligently throughout 1998 at planning and preparing for the development of small faith groups. Publicity was wide-spread, with invitations being made through mail, phone calls, personal conversations, and sign-up opportunities after weekend Masses. The result that first fall session was the involvement of over 300 parishioners and the development of over 30 small communities, with Father Herb actively participating in several of the groups!

We will continue our look at the pastorate of Father Herb Weber in our next column.

## A LITTLE FAITH

Today our readings are about faith, frustration, and how much is enough. Habakkuk is a complainer having an argument with God. Timothy is encouraging a community challenged by cowardice and the apostles want more faith than they have. Things aren't happening fast enough for any of them or for us. All of them and we want God to do something sooner rather than later and we want God to give us a reason to believe that it will all work out. What does God do? God puts it back on them--and us--telling Habakkuk to describe the world he wants; telling the apostles to do more than the expected. Doing more with less is a familiar phrase today and a reminder that a little faith may be enough even for the most difficult times.

## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Sometimes human relationships go awry, but Christ's choice for us is irrevocable. In marriage celebrations, the Church always recalls God's faithfulness to help prepare married couples for enduring the inevitable rough spots. The Byzantine liturgy does this by adorning the couple with crowns that remind them of the martyr's crown. The couple therefore takes on a vocation of witnessing to the sacredness of life in all of its suffering and joy, and of keeping their eyes fixed on the banquet of heaven. In Eastern theology, people have a liturgical vocation to give God praise, and marriage fits within that plan. It is not so much saying prayers that counts, but becoming prayer. Interestingly, in this liturgy the couple never utters a word other than joining in the community's chants; there are no marriage vows as such. There is therefore not a hint of our Western Christian sense that marriage is a legal contract. Rather, it is all about living out one's baptismal vocation, embracing the cross, pouring oneself out in love, and opening to the grace of the Holy Spirit.
