175TH ANNIVERSARY NOTES

We continue our look into the pastorate of Father John Blaser, tenth Pastor of St. Peter's.

During the late 1980's and early 1990's there was quite a lot of growth happening in our Parish. Much of that growth focused on social needs and evangelization. In 1990, for example, Pastoral Associate Sister Angeline Hoffman, C.P.P.S., began the "Stephen Ministry," which many of our parishioners still recall. The "Stephen Ministry" identified, called, trained, and supported those parishioners who took part (called Stephen Ministers) as they engaged in one-to-one ministry to other parishioners. Stephen Ministers were trained in listening skills, care-giving and accompanying parishioners who were experiencing grief, divorce, job loss, chronic or terminal illness, or some other kind of life crisis. Many parishioners took part as Stephen Ministers.

In the same time period, the Parish experienced continuing growth in the number of parishioners taking part in lay ministry in liturgy, religious education, and the RCIA. Sister Fran Schismenos, OSF/T, directed the Religious Education programs and inspired many people to volunteer for the Religious Education program and the RCIA. Although she passed away in 1998, Sister Fran is remembered as a dynamic and faith-filled leader. From 1984 until 1994 there were more parishioners than ever involved in this ministry and, happily, a steadily increasing number of converts entering the Church.

During Father Blaser's pastorate, in the Spring of 1992, the Parish Community Concerns Committee, under the leadership of Father Joseph Szybka, developed a plan to respond to the needs of the ever-increasing number of people in the Mansfield community who could not afford sufficient food to feed their families. The Feed-the-Needy Program was initiated then and still continues to this day. In 2011 an estimated 175 to 200 meals were served daily, resulting in 850 to 1,000 meals being served during each week the program operated. That resulted in some 12,000 meals being served per year, not counting the annual Thanksgiving meal program which served some 900 to 1,000 meals on Thanksgiving Day until it was discontinued a few years ago.

Also in 1992, the Parish and School entered into an affiliation with Richland New Hope which allowed them to use classroom space and facilities in the school. The New Hope participants took part in many St. Peter's School programs and both the New Hope and St. Peter's communities benefitted greatly from the experience. Regrettably, however, the guidelines for New Hope changed a few years later and the program had to be discontinued.

In 1993 and 1994, the Parish began planning for the celebration of the 150th anniversary of our founding. Plans were well underway for that effort when, in February 1994, Father Blaser announced that he would be leaving St. Peter's to begin a sabbatical. Before beginning that sabbatical, Bishop James Hoffman asked him to spend six months in the Toledo Diocesan Mission in Binga, Zimbabwe. A few months later, it was announced that Father Herbert Weber would become the eleventh Pastor of St. Peter's in July of 1994.

We will resume our study of the Pastors of St. Peter's in the next column.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Eastern Catholic and Orthodox Christians share a love for the Byzantine liturgy because it is during the Eucharist that the Church is most true to its identity, expresses its integrity, and discovers its vocation. Eastern Catholic and Orthodox Christians celebrate essentially the identical liturgy, with only very slight variations. It is a fairly complex ritual weaving together three separate layers of prayers: a liturgy prayed in the sanctuary by priests, often hidden by a curtain or screen; a liturgy sung by the assembly and led by a deacon in front of a screen formed of painted icons; and a third layer of private prayer by the priest, who prays in support of the deacon and the faithful. It is an eyes-wide-open experience, gorgeous in visuals, and filled with the sound of God's people singing prayer. The energy of the worship centers on the presence of Christ, largely through an awareness of heaven touching earth when the Church gathers to celebrate.

In the late twentieth century, Latin Rite Catholics were encouraged to embrace a style of worship that was full, conscious, and active, a value that has never been lost in the East. The liturgy has great impact in its beauty, in its poetry and contemplation, and by the actions of bowing, signing with the cross, and chanting that are required of the assembly. Contact with the Eastern Church reveals some key values that have been obscured in our own Church and are slowly being recovered.
