THE CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD**December 22** Angie Sarah

Last week, I had the opportunity to speak to the North Central Ohio Vocations Club about my role in the development office and what the club to do to help support my office and the parish as a whole. I shared with them the results of a request by Father Hite made to parishioners this time last year to consider a modest increase to their Sunday Collection gifts.

Over the past few weeks, I've had the opportunity to analyze Sunday giving trends over the last two fiscal years.

The exciting news is more than 600 families increased their gifts during the past fiscal year ending June 30th. Those gifts generated \$152,175 in additional revenues for the parish and school. However, it was offset by 542 families who decreased their contributions that equaled a reduction totaling \$146,068. The net result is about \$6,107 in new revenues. These figures do not include parishioners who died during the comparison period.

Over the last three fiscal years, our parish revenue has remained flat, which is remarkable since we've been in a capital campaign and lost nearly 300 active Sunday donors at the same time.

These facts were the opener to ask why are people leaving our faith community and what we can do about it?

We can learn some of the answers from the book "Going, Going, Gone, the Dynamics of Disaffiliation by Young Catholics, by Saint Mary's Press of Minnesota. In 2015 it commissioned a survey about young adults who were raised Catholic, but no longer identify as Catholic.

The reasons why they have left the Church are quite varied, but the study did find some common themes. Two that stood out for me was that individuals believed that religion was forced upon them by their families and that one can believe in God, live a moral life without organized religion.

So how does that relate to us as parishioners and parents? My oldest child already complains about going to church every week. I've realized in preparation for this article that I need to do a better job of explaining why going to Mass every week is essential. What can we do as a parish community to demonstrate our faith better – especially to those who have become dissatisfied?

I think back to one time when someone asked if it was ok to attend a service. My boilerplate answer was, "You are always welcome, and our doors are open." However, I could have done more to encourage them even to the point of joining our family one weekend at Mass.

I bet a majority of those who attend Mass regularly has had a friend who has invited them to their more contemporary non-denominational church. There is a reason those churches are growing, asking their friends to attend is the starting point.

The challenge is for us to look for ways to emulate what contemporary churches do without compromising the core beliefs of our faith. One of the many reasons people convert to our faith is because they believe in the real presence of the body and blood of Christ in the Eucharist. What can we do as a parish to help support our clergy so they do not have to everything on their own?

If one were to look at a parish ministry book from several years ago, you will find there were many more clubs and groups in our parish. Even the groups we have now struggle to find new volunteers. Unfortunately, there is no easy solution. We all have to be active participants and recruiters to our faith community. Otherwise, those figures at the top of this column will only continue to grow.

REASON TO REJOICE

Dark violet is used throughout Advent to express its character as a season of spiritual preparation for Christmas and "the coming of the Lord." But on the Third Sunday of Advent, formerly known as Gaudete (Latin for "rejoice") Sunday, rose may be added to the liturgical environment. The entire liturgy is infused with a spirit of rejoicing. Today's first reading and Gospel proclaim the reality of God's saving work in our midst. Isaiah exuberantly describes the idyllic transformation of all creation as a result of God's presence in the midst of the people. In the Gospel, Jesus connects Isaiah's prophecy with what is happening in his own ministry. In addition to the list of healings from Isaiah (the blind, the lame, lepers, and the deaf), Jesus' presence brings two other reasons for rejoicing: "The dead are raised, and the poor have the good news proclaimed to them" (Matthew 11:5).

END OF YEAR CHARITABLE GIFTS

The end of the year is fast approaching, and it is time to think about those last minute charitable deductions to reduce your overall tax burden. Here are a few ways that may work for you:

- 1) IRA Charitable Rollover – If you are 70 ½ or older, you can elect to make a qualified charitable distribution from your IRA. This distribution will lower your overall taxable income for the year. More seniors are taking advantage of this option and are making a one-time distribution to cover all their Sunday giving for the year.
- 2) Transfer of Appreciated Stocks – If you hold stock that has appreciated significantly you can avoid capital gains taxes and take a charitable deduction by donating it to St. Peter's. These transfers can be done electronically, so contact the Development Office for more information. Stock transfers should be initiated by December 22, 2018 to guarantee they will be completed by the end of 2019.
- 3) Doubling/Bunching your Gift – Trying to reach that itemized deduction level? One strategy to combat the new tax laws is to consider doubling or bunching your charitable gifts to every other year. Doubling may allow you to itemize your deductions in giving years instead of taking the standard deduction.

Be sure to consult your tax advisor about any questions how the new tax laws affect your personal situation.

NORTHWEST OHIO SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Apply today for a scholarship for the 2020-21 school year! Scholarships are available for your children to attend a private school or for homeschool expenses for grades K-8.

Your child may qualify for a scholarship worth up to \$1,500 at the private school of your choice or for \$500 for homeschool expenses based on your family's annual household income.

- * Families who meet the eligibility requirement and reside in one of the participating counties* can apply.
- * Scholarships payments are made directly to the school.

STATE OF OHIO SCHOOL CHOICE SCHOLARSHIPS—IMPORTANT CHANGES

Across Ohio, thousands of parents use state-funded scholarships to send their children to the school they choose. St. Peter's Catholic School is a registered "provider school" with this State of Ohio School Choice Scholarship Program.

THERE ARE SOME IMPORTANT CHANGES AND UPDATES WITH TWO OF THE STATE FUNDED SCHOLARSHIPS

Educational Choice Scholarship (EdChoice)

EdChoice provides scholarships to students who attend the state's underperforming public schools. For the 2020-2021 school year, numerous schools have been newly added to the ODE designated list of underperforming schools so students assigned to those schools are eligible for the scholarship. **Prospect, Sherman, Woodland, Madison South and Mifflin elementary schools, Mansfield Middle School, and Mansfield Senior High are some of the area public schools on the ODE designated list.**

Ed Choice Expansion

This scholarship is based only on family income. For the 2020-2021 school year, **students in ALL grades K through 12** whose family's income is at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines are eligible to apply. For example, last year a family of four earning \$51,500 or less was eligible to apply for the scholarship. *Families currently enrolled at St. Peter's who meet these requirements are eligible to apply.*

IMPORTANT: The application period for EdChoice and EdChoice Expansion scholarships is February 1 through April. Once the admission process is complete to attend St. Peter's School for the 2020-2021 school year, application for state scholarships can begin. The sooner that process begins, the better.
