FATHER HITE, PASTOR

In 2000, I was a young, eager broadcast production engineer working for the last-place TV station in Toledo, Ohio. Like most careers, I learned more about broadcasting and the news business in the first six months of that job than in four years of college.

Besides working on a team that produced the news every night, the Diocese of Toledo used the station's facilities to tape the weekly Mass for Shut-Ins program. Every two weeks, a different parish from the diocese would come in and record two Masses. After about six months on the job, I was bumped up to the producer/director of that program. It was a natural fit since I was the only Catholic on the night side production crew.

Fast forward twenty years, and my career came full circle with our new ministry to produce a weekly Mass for our parish on WMFD-TV. However, while the process of producing a TV Mass has not changed, the technology behind the production is very different. In 2000, it required nearly \$100k in broadcast equipment and a team of six engineers. In 2020, our production requires five iPads, some post-production editing software with just one person behind the camera.

Of course, I would be remiss not to include and thank the people you see in front of the camera. Our priests, musicians, lectors, and sacristans have given of their time to prepare and tape Masses several weeks in advance.

1 Peter 4:10 says, "As each one has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God's varied grace." I feel very blessed that I have been able to use my God-given talents during these times to bring Sunday Mass to so many people in not only our parish community but to the four corners of the Earth.

In addition to airing on WMFD-TV, our Mass is also uploaded to YouTube each week. It is being viewed by people all over the United States and the world – including places like Australia, South Africa, England, and Canada, to name a few. Our parish church in lil ole Mansfield is now spreading the message of Jesus Christ in ways we never could before.

However, without your support, none of this would be possible. Our parish family has provided directed gifts to fund the purchase of the air time on WMFD-TV fully. Since the dispensation of the Obligation to attend Sunday Mass is likely to continue for some time to come, we are again offering the invitation to sponsor a Sunday TV Mass.

The cost to underwrite the airtime on WMFD-TV is \$135.00. An individual, family, or organization can sponsor a Mass date. You can also donate anonymously or give a smaller amount, and it will go towards a Mass underwritten by numerous parishioners.

I look forward to the day when we can all celebrate Mass together as one parish family. In the meantime, I hope you will keep watching every Sunday on TV or online.
