REPORT FROM THE MANSFIELD AREA CATHOLIC CEMETERIES COMMITTEE

(July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020)

The Cemeteries Committee oversees operations in the Mansfield Catholic Cemetery and the Prince of Peace Catholic Cemetery and includes members from St. Mary's Catholic Church, Resurrection Parish and St. Peter's Parish. We have been in operation since Father Hite asked the Committee to form in 2014.

Activity has been slow this past year, especially in the past few months, but we did complete a few major activities. A retaining wall was reconstructed in the Mansfield Catholic Cemetery adjacent to State Street and two very old and deteriorated trees were removed. We continue to experience water line breaks in this cemetery, but we do try and make repairs as quickly as possible. To help protect this line we shut water off in early November and turn it back on by May 1 so it doesn't freeze. The line is very old and consists of several materials that continue to cause issues for us.

We have several hundred spaces left in the Mansfield Catholic Cemetery, but many are single spaces only. The Prince of Peace Cemetery has about 550 grave spaces remaining. Grave spaces are available for \$500. There are also some individual small spaces for cremated remains for \$200 in the Mansfield Catholic Cemetery.

During this past year we started with \$58,022.61 in the Cemetery Fund and ended with \$53,557.77. We did not expect the expense for the retaining wall and tree removal but additional grave space sales helped us end the year with only a moderate decline and funds. Primary income is only through the sale of grave spaces and this past year we sold 15 grave spaces.

A SHARE IN GOD'S KINGDOM

Today concludes a three-week series of Gospel texts in which we have listened to a total of seven parables about the Kingdom. The believer is asked to consider the request that God made of Solomon in today's first reading: "Ask something of me and I will give it to you" (1 Kings 3:5). Today's parables about the treasure buried in the field and the pearl of great price should prompt us to answer, "A share in your kingdom, O God!" Today we discover that the kingdom of God is beyond value, a priceless treasure. Unfortunately, our culture bombards us with things that it believes are priceless treasures—the bigger and better SUVs, antiaging and anti-balding creams and salves, miracle diets, and so much more. SAINT MARTHA (first century)

July 29

Whether you find Martha Stewart admirable or annoying, she has the perfect patron saint. Luke describes Martha—saint, not Stewart—as "burdened with much serving" (Luke 10:40). About Mary, seated, listening to Jesus, Martha complained, "Do you not care that my sister has left me by myself to do the serving?" Jesus' response, "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things . . . Mary has chosen the better part" (10:41, 42), suggests to some the superiority of the contemplative life, leaving the rest of us, supporting families, earning livings, (helping others?), as second-class Christians. But Luke introduces Martha and Mary immediately after Jesus' parable of the Good Samaritan, whom Jesus recommends as a model of practical compassion, concluding, "Go and do likewise" (10:37). Go and do! Sit and listen! Discipleship is never either/or but both/and. Jesus ministered in prayerful silence and hospitable service. Monastic calendars add Martha's sister, Mary, and brother, Lazarus, calling all three "hosts of the Lord," recalling their welcome of Jesus to their home in Bethany, reminding us Whom we welcome whenever we extend summertime hospitality!
