Hello everyone,

Just yesterday, the Diocese of Toledo was very blessed to have four men be ordained priests by Bishop Thomas: Fr. Zachary Brown, Fr. Kevin Moebius, Fr. Michael Bialorucki, and Fr. Peter Grodi. We give thanks to God for these men answering the Lord's call for them to be priests in this little corner of his vineyard. Please continue to pray for these priests as they enter into their parish assignments in the coming days. Pray especially for the one who is coming to take my place here at St. Peter's! This is unknown as I write this because the Bishop makes the official public announcement immediately following the ordination Mass.

It is actually quite a moving experience to be present for an ordination Mass. As priests, we see the men being ordained and we fondly remember everything that brought us to the same powerful moment years prior when we were laying prostrate and kneeling in the same spots on the floor of the cathedral sanctuary. We call to mind the many people who were instrumental in fostering within us the ability to not only listen to what the Lord Jesus was telling us, but who also gave us the courage to do it- to lay down our lives and be completely at the Lord's service, no matter what he would later ask us to do as priests.

At the same time, while we concelebrate the ordination Mass, we notice the brother priests around us and are inspired by the priests who have been ordained longer than we ourselves have. There is a great consolation in this! Seeing how the Lord has used these men as his instruments in numerous different manners and locations, we are confirmed in our knowledge that he will provide for us as we continue in his service. We are grateful for the gift of the sacraments, we are grateful for our Bishop, and we are grateful for the many faithful people of God that we have met and will meet in our parishes.

As I have come to the end of my assignment here at St. Peter's, I can definitely say that I am very grateful for the many ways the Lord has blessed me through all of you. From the first day I arrived here, I experienced the kindness and generosity of this community and that has continued for the past three years. I wish I could say goodbye to everyone as we normally would, but with the COVID restrictions/precautions, that is unfortunately not possible at the moment. However, when we get back to "normal" and the restrictions are lifted, I hope to come back to say goodbye properly.

As I write this, I am surrounded by boxes and my sitting room looks much more like a war room. However, as I pack these boxes, I am also surrounded by many memories of the many different people I have met here and the many different experiences I have had. Many have asked me if they can come to Paulding County to visit me at my new parish. Certainly! Please know that you are always welcome at my parish and I do hope to see you there sometime. Divine Mercy Parish is about a two-hour drive, so I understand that it will not be easy for some to get there. But until then, or even if you cannot, we can always meet in the Sacred Heart, because there is no distance in the Eucharist!

Many thanks to Fr. Hite and the parish staff for their patience, kindness, and help as I learned the ropes of parish life. Also, many thanks to all of you. Thank you for your support over the last three years and know that St. Peter's will always hold a special place in my heart!

# **Daily Prayer**

Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

# Reflection

At first glance, today's reading seems a little harsh. Jesus seems to be saying that we should set aside love of parents and siblings or else we are not worthy of his love for us. The key word is *more*. Jesus exhorts us to place our love for him above all others, but not instead of others. In fact, when we read the Gospel carefully we discover that we come to love the Lord through others, and we love others because of the Lord. It is an integrated love affair that we have with the Lord; it is a wonderful grace that we cannot live without!

## SAINT JUNÍPERO SERRA (1713-1784)

July 1

No one who has stood before the quiet majesty of Mission San Juan Capistrano, or the altogether different but no less lovely Mission Dolores in San Francisco, or any of the missions from San Diego to Sonoma can fail to bless the Franciscan padre who, while not founder of each, was inspiration for them all, Saint Junípero Serra. Abandoning the comfortable academic life to which his doctorate in theology entitled him, Serra journeyed to the New World where his tireless traveling, dramatic preaching, and penitential austerity converted thousands of native peoples. Saving souls and celebrating the sacraments were Padre Serra's primary mission but not his only one. Education in letters and crafts, trades and agriculture transformed the people, while roads and irrigation systems transfigured the landscape. His more than thirty years of ministry were not free from conflict with authorities or without controversy in the retrospectively critical eye of history. But when John Paul II beatified him in 1988, he praised Padre Serra for assisting his converts to use their new faith to advance their true human development.
