Diocesan Priest Placed on Administrative Leave Following His Arrest

Bishop Daniel E. Thomas has placed Father Michael Zacharias, a priest of the Diocese of Toledo and pastor of St. Michael the Archangel parish in Findlay, on administrative leave effective immediately. This action was taken immediately upon receiving word of his arrest this morning in Findlay. The Diocese has been informed of the grave and reprehensible charges of a sexual nature, with minors and adults, and is cooperating fully with law enforcement.

In response to this initial information, Bishop Daniel Thomas expressed his revulsion at the charges, remarking, "I am profoundly shocked and grieved to learn of these charges against one of our priests. The Church cannot and will not tolerate any such behavior and takes any sexual abuse or misconduct on the part of a cleric with the utmost seriousness. As we await the outcome of the criminal investigation, our prayers go out to anyone affected by this situation."

Father Zacharias was ordained a priest in 2002 and these are the first such allegations to be raised against him.

In accordance with the <u>Policy for the Protection of Minors and Young People</u>, while on administrative leave, Father Zacharias cannot exercise public priestly ministry, administer any of the Sacraments, wear clerical attire or present himself as a priest. Administrative leave is a precautionary measure while an allegation is being investigated.

Any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor by a priest, deacon, staff member or volunteer affiliated with the Diocese of Toledo should first be reported to local law enforcement where the abuse is alleged to have occurred. To report any allegation regarding this case, please first contact the FBI at 216-622-6842. Please also report any such allegation to the Diocesan Victim Assistance Coordinator at 419-214-4880.

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

It was with profound shock that on the morning of Tuesday, August 18, 2020, our diocese learned of the arrest of Father Michael Zacharias, a priest of the Diocese of Toledo and pastor of St. Michael the Archangel Parish in Findlay. I immediately placed him on administrative leave due to charges of grave and reprehensible behavior, sexual in nature, with minors and adults. Father Zacharias was ordained a priest in 2002, and these are the first such allegations to be raised against him.

As ministers of Christ and His Church, priests promise to lead morally upright lives. An alleged betrayal such as this of those promises, deeply wounds the Body of Christ, especially anyone who was violated and all those affected by such immoral actions. Emotions of disbelief, anger, and numbness are understandable in the face of these revelations, sentiments which I personally share with you.

I know for many people trust in the Church has been eroded because of similar historical scandals, and that trust has now been further diminished. It is unfathomable that, given all that victims have suffered and the Church has endured; given all of the work that has been done and continues to be done to protect children, to demand accountability, to provide a safe environment, and to ensure the integrity of the priesthood, still sometimes evil has its way. Nevertheless, be assured that the Church cannot and will not tolerate any sexual abuse or misconduct on the part of any cleric.

This must be a time where we beg for the Lord's grace, once again entrusting ourselves to His mercy, choosing Christ who is our light amidst the darkness, so that together we may move forward with truth, justice, and renewed faith as committed disciples of Jesus.

For those of you with children, I know that addressing this matter can be a difficult conversation. However, it is important as families to discuss in an age-appropriate way how sin can lead us astray from our relationship with the Lord, reassuring them that Jesus remains in and with His Church.

In lifting up all affected by this situation, we also lift up one another in prayer, trusting in the healing and reconciliation that only the Lord can give. Be assured of my prayers for you and your families, even as I depend on your good prayers.



One of the things I never truly appreciated about my mother, until she was gone, was how she was the keeper of memories for us. It has been almost eight years since she has passed and I find myself scrambling in the deep recesses of my brain trying to recall stories she told about our childhood or information about our family and her life. Sometimes I think I am recalling them correctly, other times I am sure I am off the mark.

One of the things that I find most daunting about my own motherhood has been taking on the role of the "keeper of memories" for my children. I have to say I have failed tremendously with creating scrapbooks and baby books... my youngest someday will wonder if he actually hatched out of an egg because I have accomplished nothing for him so far. I had great intentions of writing down each month milestones they achieved and things that they were interested in, but that too has fallen by the wayside.

On occasion my boys will ask me about this or that they did when they were younger, and again the search through my mind begins, sometimes with accuracy and other times not. It seems that when I was younger my recall was a lot better, so I am chalking it up to an aging process, but I feel this tremendous weight on my shoulders when I stop and think about how if I do not hold the memories for them, they may not have them later on.

Our histories are such a defining part about us, and tell an incredible story of the person that we become. As I speak to my little ones now, I realize that because they seem to float in and out of a world of make believe, it is critical that I invest a little more time into making sure that they get these memories right so that they have an accurate depiction of who they are, who they have become, and who they are destined to be.

That is why I think that making sure they have a good foundation of education in their faith is so critical to me. We live in a world where there is so much misinformation at times distributed about our faith. It would be very easy for them to get swept into a frenzy of stories about the Catholic faith that are at best misguided and at worst a complete fallacy. Their participation in a religious education program helps to assure that they will come to a deep understanding of where they have come from, through our rich Church history, who they are, based on their baptismal calls, and who they are destined to be in light of God's calling for them.

Our parish is blest to have two fantastic religious education programs available for young people. The first, of course, is with our Catholic School which is a pre-K to twelve program which is steeped in a faith based curriculum that encourages high academic achievement for all students. The second, for those who do not choose the school option, is our Parish School of Religion program (PSR).

One of the most important things you can do as a parent is to provide your children with the tools they need to be successful in life, and a faith education is absolutely one of those tools. For more information on either of these wonderful programs, contact the parish office.

RCIA - RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS





THE CROSS OF JESUS

The perception of a cross changed dramatically after Jesus' crucifixion. Before that event, death on a cross was not only horrible, it was degrading. It was a penalty reserved only for the most wretched of criminals. The word "glory" would not have found its way into the same sentence containing the word "cross." But all that changed with Jesus. Over time, believers began to venerate and honor the cross. They painted, sculpted, and carved images of it. Many lost their own lives for their association with it. Today our reverence for and relationship with the cross recalls little of the contempt originally associated with it. As it has been through the ages, it is our perception of the cross that determines how we follow Jesus.

SAINT GREGORY THE GREAT (540-604)

September 3

Imagine, fourteen hundred years after death, boasting a best-selling CD! Yet outside the Church and within, Gregorian chant is enjoying a renaissance. Still, the timeless sacred music that bears his name is but part of Gregory's legacy. Renouncing civic service for monastic life, Gregory's administrative and diplomatic skills prompted continual summons from the cloister. Papal ambassador and advisor, he was eventually elected pope himself, renowned as a wise steward of the church's material possessions, generous benefactor of the poor, sponsor of missionaries, and promotor of monasticism. His liturgical enrichment of the Church endures not only in Gregorian chant, but in eloquent homilies still gracing the Liturgy of the Hours, the "Gregorian Canon" (Eucharistic Prayer I), and his spiritual classic, Pastoral Care, once presented to new bishops at ordination. Of countless impressive papal titles—Supreme Pontiff, Vicar of Christ, Successor of Saint Peter, Prince of the Apostles—the title still so cherished that it heads official documents is the one Gregory coined to describe his papal ideal: Servant of the Servants of God. Together with being designated "the Great," a fitting epitaph.
