PRISON MINISTRY CORNER

Thank you for your ongoing prayers for our brothers at Mansfield Correctional and Richland Correctional. Father Kevin and Deacon John continue their excellent ministries at ManCl, with weekly Mass and more. We will return to RiCl in the near future. Plans are underway for retraining and religious services there. Additional note: We are once again collecting plastic bags for use in a parish project (see Adult Faith item page 4) and for eventual use in the prison.

LIFTING OF THE DISPENSATION FROM THE **OBLIGATION TO ATTEND HOLY MASS ON** SUNDAYS AND HOLY DAYS OF OBLIGATION

Together, the Bishops of Ohio have decided that the general obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation (including the Saturday/Vigil Mass) is to be reinstated. This will take effect in the Dioceses of Ohio the weekend of June 5-6, 2021.

As has always been the case, those who are ill, have significant health risk factors or care for someone who is immunocompromised or ill, are exempt from attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation, as well as those who have significant fear or anxiety of contracting the coronavirus in a large group of persons (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2181).

LITURGICAL GUIDELINES—EFFECTIVE JUNE 5

- Face Masks are not required —The personal decision by some members of the clergy or the faithful to continue wearing masks/facial coverings should be respected out of charity.
- Seating will no longer be limited Rows will not be limited/closed. According to pastoral need, a designated socially distanced area may be provided for those who prefer such seating.
- Holy water fonts will be filled Holy Water fonts will continued to be filled and cleaned on a regular basis.
- The Sign of Peace May be resumed. The Sign of Peace does not imply physical touch with others. Some members of the faithful may still be reluctant to extend/receive a physical Sign of Peace and their preference for no physical contact should be respected.
- Holy Communion reception on the hand or tongue is the prerogative of the communicant.
- Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion may resume their service in a limited capacity.



TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The roots of today's "birthday of the Church" are in an ancient Jewish festival of springtime harvest, seven weeks after Passover. Now, seven weeks after Easter, our great fifty days of rejoicing come to an end. In the countries where the Church first came to life, this is a time of harvest, and the first fruits appear: apricots and lemons, cherries and strawberries. Even in our gardens, herbs are abundant and asparagus, that close relation of the Easter lily, comes fresh to our tables. The earth is laden with so much new life, and that has always been a sign to Christians of Easter's glory.

Pentecost means "fifty" and our fifty days of Easter joy are complete. This Sunday is a day to savor the glory of Easter once more: picnics and cookouts, walks by the water, time in the garden—are all ways of extending the feast. Notice the paschal candle to-day, still burning during Mass. Our Easter celebration now complete, the candle will soon be moved to a place near the baptismal font, and be lighted at baptisms and funerals as a silent witness to Christ's abiding presence.
