Anyone who has studied sacred scripture for any length of time can attest to the richness of our scriptures. There is always more to be found than we expect. Personally, I am very fond of the scriptures that talk about the ways in which God rescues us...the way he extends himself into our lives to heal, to strengthen, and to rescue. Today's scriptures focus on God's intervention.

The first reading from the Book of Wisdom gives us an idea of the way things ought to be. It is the interference of the devil that has distorted our lives and our world, and has introduced us to death. God's desire, as depicted in this reading, is for a blissful and healthy existence and for a right relationship between us and God. Made as we are, in the image of his own nature, we are meant to be imperishable. But we know that each of us is going to die, hopefully after a long and happy life, and the last sentence of the first reading makes it clear that all of us will die. If this were the end of the story, this would not be a very consoling reading.

The Psalm calls us to look beyond any such bleak endings. Phrases in the psalm's verses like, "... You drew me clear..." or "...You preserved me from among those going down into the pit..." or "...You changed my mourning into dancing," all give us an idea of God's restorative power. The second stanza of the response calls on all of the Lord's faithful to give thanks to his name because his anger lasts but a moment and his goodwill lasts a lifetime. At the moment like this in our reading of the Psalms, it's good to remember that this is the word of God and that God is faithful. If he promises he will do it then, as they say, you can take that to the bank.

The challenge here is, as Jesus says to Jairus, to have faith. The whole of today's gospel is intent on calling us to faith. The woman with the hemorrhage of blood faced a more difficult choice than Jairus. In her condition, she was regarded in Hebrew religious terms as unclean. In theory, she should not even have been out in public. But her illness and her despair of ever being well again overcame her fear of societal and religious restriction. She could not bring herself to speak to Jesus to seek his help. She was certain that if she just touched his garments she would be healed. And she was right. I don't think we should suppose that Jesus didn't know what was going on around him even at that moment. Asking the question about who touched him was really a lead-in to a lesson about faith. "Daughter, your faith has healed you..."

Synagogue officials like Jairus would not have been inclined to approach Jesus for help. He was, after all, one of their sharpest critics. That did not stop Jairus from approaching Jesus. Love for his daughter and the desire to save her from death were all that he needed to overcome the rabbinical disdain for Jesus. After word of the daughter's death reached them, there seemed to be no reason to proceed. But Jesus is intent on showing that faith is more powerful than death. If we rightly put our faith in Jesus, we will see that he is not just the Lord of the living, but also the Lord of the dead, and of all creation.

To be clear, faith is a gift, and so we must pray...we must ask God for the gift of faith. May this week find us asking God for faith. "Lord, I believe. Help Thou my unbelief!"

### JESUS' EXAMPLE OF HELPING OTHERS

In today's second reading Paul offers a wonderful argument to his converts at Corinth for seeking to help those in need. He is dealing with a practical problem, arranging a collection for the poor of the church of Jerusalem; but as he often does, he develops an important teaching about Jesus to make his point.

After asking that they show their faith by generous gifts, he reminds them of the "gracious act of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, for your sake he became poor, so that by his poverty you might become rich" (2 Corinthians 8:9). In the Incarnation our Lord assumed our human nature, certainly becoming poor for one who is God. The ultimate gracious act of this poverty was going to the cross with all its terrible sufferings. By this act of poverty we definitely become rich. Now our sins can be forgiven; we can share in the very life of God through the sacraments; we can attain eternal salvation!

### FEAST OF FAITH

### **Preparation of the Gifts**

The altar is prepared, the gifts are received. Several brief rites follow with accompanying prayers, some prayed silently by the priest and deacon and others said aloud. We call this part of the Mass the "preparation." What kind of preparation is happening? First, the presider holds up the paten or bowl containing the hosts, and says words that Jesus must have said many times, since they derive from ancient Jewish meal prayers: "Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation!" We have brought forward our gifts, our offering to God, and now we acknowledge that they are not really ours—the gifts that we give are God's gift to us. It is "through your goodness" that we have gifts to offer. It is significant that we offer not wheat and grapes, but bread and wine; "fruit of the earth and work of human hands." Bread and wine are both God's work, and ours. These preparatory rites also prepare us for what we are about to do in the Eucharist, a mystery in which divine and human meet; a holy collaboration in which our action is caught up into God's divine plan.
