From the Pastor:

As I mentioned at the Masses last Sunday, my name is Fr. Miller and I'm your new pastor. I'm very happy to finally be here. Transitioning from one parish to another is always challenging for us priests for many reasons. Packing our belongings and moving them to a new parish is difficult, even when we don't have that much, as in my case. Packing is still hard because we priests know we are leaving behind familiar faces, who have become our friends and family. I'm happy to be through that process and here where I will begin to make new friends and family members.

My full name is Fr. John Miller. My parents named each of their children (my siblings) after a saint, and for me, it was St. John the Baptist. He was a very impressive person who lived his life for Christ, preparing the way of the Lord. That's a great focus for any priest! The reason I mention this about my name is that some of you have asked how I want to be addressed, knowing that some priests use their first name and others use their last name. Please refer to me as Fr. Miller. When you say that, you'll get my attention, even in a crowd of people.

My email address is miller.john@myspartans.org and my cell phone number is 419-217-0228. In the other parishes I've been, some of the parishioners were surprised that I listed my cell phone number, and even cautioned me not to do so. I've never had a problem with people misusing it and I'm confident the same will be true here in Mansfield. I provide it for your benefit, especially sick calls during the night. Please keep in mind that I don't monitor my phone ever second of the day. There are only so many emails, phone calls, and text messages that I can respond to in a day.

The property and buildings of this parish are as big as any of the parishes in our diocese. There is nothing small about this parish! Fr. Kevin has been a great help to me in learning about lights, doors, security systems, etc. I've been meeting with the staff and learning about what they do. At some point in the weeks ahead, I'll meet with the various parish councils and committees. (According to my count, there are eight of these, but I'm the new guy!) I look forward to working with them to learn more about this parish and their help in providing input for moving forward.

Lastly for this week, a spiritual thought based on the Scripture readings for this Sunday. Jesus empowers the Apostles (the Twelve) with His own authority and sends them forth to do the same work Christ was doing. Then Jesus tells them not to take the normal things people take when they travel – food, money, baggage, etc. Jesus does this because he knows that will become their primary focus instead of where Jesus wants them to focus. Too often we think about and focus on the material instead of the spiritual.

School Choice was a big winner in the new State of Ohio budget bill increasing scholarship amounts for this upcoming school year.

The Ohio EdChoice Scholarship window has reopened! **Parishioners who qualify for an EdChoice Scholarships and a Parishioner Scholarship can have 100% of their tuition costs covered! Does my family qualify?**

Catholic Parishioner Scholarship — All families who are registered members of the parish and actively participate in their faith — automatically qualify for a Parishioner Scholarship.

EdChoice Expansion Scholarship — If your annual household gross income does not exceed the limits based on the chart to the right, you qualify for an EdChoice Expansion Scholarship.

EdChoice Traditional Scholarship — If you live in the Mansfield City School District and your child is assigned to any school (except Woodland), you automatically are eligible for a scholarship! If you live inside Mansfield City Schools but are open enrolled in another school district, you can transfer to St. Peter's on scholarship.

However, if your household income is above these limits, you can still apply for traditional financial aid. We still have aid available for the upcoming school year. Parishioners and alumni donate tens of thousands each year to assist families who want a Catholic education for their children. It's their way of giving back for the great education they received.

GOD CHOSE US

Who chose first, God or you? That is the question explored in today's three readings. The second reading, from Paul's Letter to the Ephesians, reads almost like a hymn. It praises God for choosing us, for calling us to serve, and for blessing us in our service. Paul makes it clear how honored we are and how special is the call to live as children of God. This is through no doing of our own.

The first reading and the Gospel use prose rather than poetry to describe the same truth: God did the choosing, not us. When the prophet Amos was berated for being a prophet, he retorted that the whole thing wasn't his idea in the first place. Neither did the twelve apostles in today's Gospel ask for their calling. Jesus sent them forth, two by two, to do the work of his kingdom.

FEAST OF FAITH

Invitation to the Eucharistic Prayer

After the presider washes his hands, he turns to the people and says, "Pray that our sacrifice may be acceptable to God the almighty Father." We have brought forward bread and wine, and now we are asked to see in these simple gifts upon the altar a sacrifice offered to God. Our response is rich in theological meaning. "May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands."

The words point to the unique role of the priest, whose hands, at his ordination, were anointed for just this purpose: that he might "sanctify the Christian people and offer sacrifice to God" (Rite of Ordination). We ask God to accept our sacrifice not because it is worthy of God, but simply "for the praise and glory of his name."

God does not need our offering, but allows us to give it so that we might grow in holiness. And God, never to be outdone in generosity, gives all that we have given back to us, "for our good and the good of all his Church." This Mass benefits not just those who have gathered, but, in the mysterious economy of grace, the whole Church. In the words of Saint Paul, when one part rejoices, the whole body "share[s] its joy" (1 Corinthians 12:26).
