


#### **FREEDOM**

As we celebrate our nation's independence, we pray for freedom...freedom to always pursue truth, freedom to use our God-given time, talent, and treasure to help others, freedom to open our eyes to those around us who are suffering, hungry, lonely.

May we take to heart God's message to each of us in today's readings. Ezekiel tells us that as the Lord's words came to him, the spirit entered into him and set him on his feet! God had a challenging task for Ezekiel. He was sending him to His people who had become "hard of face and obstinate of heart." I find some consolation in the final verse: "Whether they heed or resist – for they are a rebellious house – they shall know that a prophet has been among them." How are we being called this week to reach out and share the Good News with others – no matter whether we are accepted or scorned?

In the second reading, we hear Paul tell us about the thorn in his flesh, his attempts to beg the Lord to take away this pain, challenge, or affliction, AND his acceptance of God's message: "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." How are we being called this week to put aside our own complaints and reach out and share the Good News with others, truly believing God's grace is enough?

Finally, the Gospel.... Jesus is teaching in the synagogue in his home town and the people who have known him all his life are not only astonished, but they take offense! Those last two verses hit home with me: "So he was not able to perform any mighty deed there, apart from curing a few sick people by laying his hands on them. He was amazed at their lack of faith." Will we reach out and share the Good News this week...or will Jesus be amazed at our lack of faith?

#### PRISON MINISTRY CORNER

Our RiCI brothers have had the opportunity to share their thoughts and feelings about our time apart over the 15 months of Covid-time. They recognized moments of grace by witnessing men helping others, especially those in need of physical assistance.

They saw changes in the attitudes of staff members, with a greater sense of everyone looking after each other. One of our brothers reported the nurses from the infirmary came to the pods to administer meds.

Sadly, eight RiCI inmates died of Covid. Some of our men in the Catholic community knew all eight, and one of the men who died was a faithful member of our community who had attended every Mass, Rosary group, and catechism class.



#### **NO BAD NEWS**

There are many times when we say, "Tell me what I want to hear, and don't confuse me with facts." And we don't take kindly to someone who might be bold enough to snuff out our expectations.

The biggest problem with such an attitude is not that we miss out on the truth or the facts, but that we miss out on the new and surprising gifts others can give us. Like the townspeople in today's Gospel story, we too often refuse to allow others to display the talents that can be good news for us.

Today's readings call for hospitality and faith and discernment. Hospitality opens the doors of our hearts and minds to the "stranger" among us, no matter how familiar he or she may seem to be. Faith enables us to accept the gifts of others, no matter how alarming or "strange" they may seem to be. Discernment helps us discover the prophets in our midst, no matter how amazing they may seem to be. Hospitality, faith, and discernment—cultivate these. Then, nobody can bring bad news.

#### **FEAST OF FAITH**

#### **Preparation of the Gifts**

Two small rites—or, as one liturgist has called them, "little mysteries"—accompany the preparation of the gifts. The priest or deacon takes a small cruet of water from the server and adds a drop of water to the wine. Then, after the elevation of the chalice (and the incensation, if incense is used), the priest washes his hands. Both of these actions were at first practical, matter-of-fact realities: in the ancient world the wine was usually quite thick, and was generally mixed with water before it was drunk. And in the early church, when the faithful brought forward a great variety of gifts at this time, there was a definite need for the presider to wash his hands!

But now these rites serve a purely symbolic function. The mingling of the water and wine is accompanied by a prayer that speaks of the wonderful exchange of the Mass, the mingling of Christ's divinity and our humanity. And as the priest washes his hands, he prays words of supplication from Psalm 51, acknowledging his own sinfulness in the presence of the assembly before he dares to approach the altar for this most sacred action.
