From the Pastor:

In my conversation with a parishioner this past week, she spoke of her surprise at seeing several inches of snow on the ground early Tuesday morning. I too was slightly surprised with the snow even though I know it is winter. However, my surprise quickly gave way to joy as I pondered the wonder of God's creation and the thought that Christmas is near. Be sure to plan the remaining three weeks before Christmas so you are spiritually ready to enter into the joy of Christ's birth. The alternative is to be "surprised" and unprepared for the Christmas celebration. The following parish events are meant to help you and your children prepare.

This coming Saturday (Dec. 11), an Advent Youth Retreat is being offered here at the parish for children ages 3-10. They will take a journey with the Holy Family to experience the events of Jesus's birth. They will experience what it was like to journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem as Mary and Joseph did for the census that year. They will meet the "real life" personalities of Mary, Joseph, the Magi and Shepherds. As all this activity and excitement stirs their hunger pains, they will experience an authentic meal that the Holy Family would have eaten so long ago. After a few other activities, including crafts, they will attend the Saturday evening Mass. The cost is \$10 per child, begins at 11am, and will be in the high school.

In two weeks from this Sunday, our parish music ministry members will combine the songs of Christmas with the inspiring words of Sacred Scripture for what is known as "Lessons and Carols". This will occur in the church and is sure to bring our minds and hearts into the mystery, joy, and wonder of Christmas. I hope you will plan to attend and consider inviting family members and friends to attend also. Christmas is a celebration for everyone because Jesus came for every human person. Mark your calendars for 3pm, Sunday, Dec. 19 in the church.

While you are marking your calendar, also note Dec. 22 & 23 as "days of grace" here at St. Peter. The sacrament of Reconciliation will be offered at 12 noon, 3 pm, and 6 pm. At each of these times, Fr. Kevin and I will be in the church until the last person's confession is heard. Even though we offer this sacrament before every Mass, we provide these extra opportunities for your convenience and your spiritual benefit. In the gospel this Sunday, we hear John the Baptist preparing the way of the Lord by vigorously calling the people to repent and seek forgiveness of their sins. We are truly blest to have this wonderful sacrament of healing.

Lastly for this week, Wednesday is solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. The bulletin lists three Mass times for this holy day of obligation. I hope you will join us when we celebrate God's grace bringing forth the new Eve. Like Eve, Mary came into the world without sin. However, unlike Eve, she never used her freedom for anything sinful. Mary, pray for us!

END OF THE YEAR CHARITABLE GIVING

The end of the year is fast approaching, and it is time to think about those last-minute charitable deductions and reduce your 2021 tax burden. Here are a few ways that may work for you.

IRA Charitable Rollovers

If you are 70 1/2 or older, you can elect to make a qualified charitable distribution from your IRA. This distribution will lower your overall taxable income for the year. More seniors are taking advantage of this option and are making a one-time distribution to cover all their annual stewardship gifts for the year.

Transfer of Appreciated Stocks

The President's Build Back Better Act includes tax increases on capital gains taxes for certain individuals. If you donate appreciated stock, you make a charitable gift and avoid paying the capital gains taxes. These transfers can be done electronically, so contact the Development Office for more information. Stock transfers should be initiated by December 22 to guarantee they will be completed before the end of the year.

Elimination of the 60% Charitable Limit

Under the CARES Act, Congress temporarily modified the contribution limits for individuals and allows individuals who itemize to deduct qualified charitable contributions up to 100% of their adjusted gross income. The excess contributions will be carried forward for the next five years. These changes only apply to cash contributions made to a 50% charity, excluding supporting organizations and donor-advised funds. Stock donations and gifts to private foundations are still subject to the 30% of AGI rule.

Eliminating the contribution limit creates a huge opportunity for donors who want to make a significant impact to charities this year. Under these rules, a donor could take a significant distribution from their IRA, rather than the annual \$100,000 limit, donate it to charity, and take a deduction for the full amount. If you're considering leaving a large portion of your IRA to charity in your estate, this may be a year to consider a large gift, especially if you are expecting to have a taxable estate. You could benefit from tax savings and also see the benefits your charitable donation produces during your lifetime.

Gifts can be made to St. Peter's School and the Msgr. Dunn Foundation are tax-deductible. If you have any general questions on you can call the Development Office for more information.
