From the Pastor:

This weekend will mark another major accomplishment in the rich history of this parish. When the current church building was constructed a century ago, the parishioners made great sacrifices to erect a structure that was much more than an ordinary building. Like many church buildings of its time, it was noble and magnificent in comparison to any other structure, and it still remains so today. Catholics built churches like ours to “speak” through every aspect of the building’s design. Just as we are called to evangelize, so too should our buildings.

At the center of the Catholic Faith, and therefore of our churches, is Jesus Christ. The central event of Jesus's life is the perfect gift of Himself, beginning in the upper room at the Last Supper and culminating on the cross at Calvary. This is the climactic moment of Jesus’s life to which everything before and after points. We are reminded of this at Mass most powerfully with the priest’s prayers at the altar. As we recall Christ's great love for humanity, we are renewed and reinvigorated in the Christian way of life. It is fitting that in our church of marble and stained glass, the altar should be made of similar material.

At the vigil Mass this Saturday, Bishop Thomas consecrates the new altar with sacred chrism, the same blessed oil which is used for the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Priestly Ordination. The words of the prayer the Church provides for such an occasion are very insightful. In that prayer, Bishop Thomas says of our church: “This house brings to light the mystery of the Church.” Our church building does this well. However, the prayer continues by saying in “this house” we are instructed and nourished when we gather for prayer and worship. In doing so, Jesus is empowering and inspiring us to do the same for the world. We are to bring to light the mystery of the Church, which is Christ, to family, friend, and neighbor.

During the entrance procession, a relic of St. John the Evangelist is brought forth. It is inserted and sealed into the new altar before the altar is anointed with sacred chrism. Just as we appreciate those who sacrificed to build our church, even more so do appreciate and love those who sacrificed for the Church. John the Evangelist followed Jesus all the way to the Cross, and we are blest to have a small physical reminder of him in the altar. Let us ask him for prayers so that we will heroically follow Christ like he did.

We are also blest this weekend to have St. Luke's Production on campus for **Tolton: From Slave to Priest**. This play is a true story about a young black man who overcame the injustice and evil of his time to follow God’s call of him becoming a priest. I highly encourage you to attend this free showing in our school auditorium. Here are what some people have already said: “We saw this production last night at our parish... wonderful and very moving.” “The show got a standing ovation.” “[We] just watched the production at our church. What a blessing! A must see...brilliant acting from the heart.” I hope to see you there!



Tolton: From Slave to Priest

Tolton is a powerful new live production based on the life of Fr. Augustus Tolton, the first African American priest. This compelling true story of courage, forgiveness, and reconciliation resonates deeply with modern American audiences.

A Polish Christmas Tradition

The tradition of the Oplatki originated in Poland during Early Christian times. This Christmas Custom began with a simple white wafer, baked from flour and water. The wafers are wonderfully designed to display Christmas images, such as the Nativity.

HOW TO CELEBRATE THE OPLATKI TRADITION

The Oplatki are enjoyed by families, typically right before the Christmas Eve meal. The entire family will gather around the table with the Oplatek.

Generally the eldest member of the family will begin the ritual by breaking off a piece of the wafer and passing it to another family member with a blessing. This blessing can simply consist of what you desire for your loved one in the upcoming year – whether it be good health, success, or happiness. The purpose of this act is primarily to express ones unconditional love and forgiveness for each member of his or her family.

THE SYMBOLISM

The significance of the Oplatki Christmas wafer is in that it shadows the Eucharistic meal that Catholics participate in at each Mass. Just as we share in the Eucharist as one family in Christ and receive Christ's love through the Eucharist, the Oplatki allows for one's immediate family to come together and share the love they have for one another. This symbolism is deepened by the fact that the name of the town where Jesus Christ was born, Bethlehem, means "House of Bread," which makes the Oplatki tradition an especially beautiful way to celebrate the charity and unity so characteristic of the Christmas season.



FEAST OF FAITH
Blessing and Dismissal

At the beginning of Mass, the priest made the sign of the cross with us. At the conclusion of Mass, he makes the sign of the cross over us, a sign of blessing. We are then dismissed—not just let out, but sent forth with a mission “to love and serve the Lord.”

As we leave the church, we bear the invisible sign of the Master whom we follow. In the words of an ancient letter to Diognetus, “Christians are indistinguishable from other [people] either by nationality, language, or customs. They do not inhabit separate cities of their own, or speak a strange dialect, or follow an outlandish way of life. . . . And yet, there is something extraordinary about their lives” (Liturgy of the Hours, Vol. II, p. 840).
