

FROM THE PASTOR

Christmas is very near! That means many of us are busy with social gatherings and completing our own preparations for Christmas. As you do so, please keep in mind the following parish related items.

First, this Sunday afternoon (3pm) you are invited to join me and our parish musical groups in church for Christmas Lessons and Carols. Knowing our musical talent here at St. Peter and the acoustics of the church, I'm looking forward to a wonderful hour of voices and instruments together with select Scripture passages. It's a great opportunity to be drawn deeper into the joy and wonder of Christmas. I hope to see you there.

Second, the students of our parish school are enjoying Christmas break this week and next week. As a result, the Wednesday Mass time will be the same as the summer schedule (7am) for the next two weeks. The parish office will remain open according to its normal schedule, with the exception of being closed the next two Fridays in observance of Christmas and New Year Day. If you have an emergency, you can still contact us priests via phone or

Third, you are invited to join your fellow parishioners this Tuesday afternoon to decorate the church. The group that does this each year are parish volunteers who are eager to bring the beauty of Christmas into our church. Their size has become smaller in recent years as their regular volunteers have aged. You could help decorate trees, hang garlands, move plants, or help with the heavier work of setting up trees or moving statues. The work in the church will start at 1:00pm and conclude at 5:00pm with pizza and fellowship in the basement. I hope to see vou there!

Fourth, since Christmas this year occurs on Saturday, be sure to look closely at the Mass schedule for the entire three-day weekend. All the Mass times are different than normal. The church will be open at least one hour before every Mass. Advanced preparations have been made to ensure the sidewalks and parking lots are plowed and salted.

Lastly, the most important preparation for Christmas involves improving our love and devotion for God. Every person is a "work in progress" with this. We love God, but not yet to the fullest of our ability. Even the saints would say this. Each of us should be grateful for the progress we have made with this, but also eager for further growth and progress. An essential part of this growth involves the sacrament of Confession. Each of us needs the forgiveness and special graces this sacrament provides.

To make this sacrament as available to you as possible, two priests will be in the church this Wednesday and Thursday at 12noon, 3pm, and 6pm. I will be in the confessional and Fr. Kevin will be sitting in the front pew near the piano. We will remain in the church for at least 30 minutes, or until all confessions are heard. If it's been years since your last confession, you don't need to be anxious. Come to the sacrament knowing your sins and having sorrow for them, and the priest will do the rest.

RCIA CHANGED TO OCIA - ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

Following the trend of updating all liturgical texts to reflect greater fidelity to the original Latin, the U.S. bishops, meeting in Baltimore for their annual fall assembly, approved on Nov. 17 a revised English edition of the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults. The English version passed 215-0 with two abstentions.

The action still needs the approval of the Vatican's Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments before it takes effect. Please keep in prayer the catechumens and candidates preparing to celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation at St. Peter's, St. Mary of the Snows, and Resurrection Parishes. Our class meets Dec. 15, then resumes Jan. 5.



BLESSING OF A CHRISTMAS MANGER

In its present form the custom of displaying figures depicting the birth of Jesus Christ owes its origin to St. Francis of Assisi, who made the Christmas crèche or manger for Christmas Eve of 1223.

The blessing of the Christmas manger or nativity scene may take place on the Vigil of Christmas or at another suitable time. When the manger is set up in the home, it is appropriate that it be blessed by a parent or another family member.

All make the sign of the cross as the leader says:

Our help is in the name of the Lord. R/. Who made heaven and earth.

One of those present or the leader reads a text of sacred Scripture, for example, Luke 2:1 (lines 1-8) or Isaiah 7:10 (lines 10-15, the birth of Emmanuel).

Reader: The Gospel of the Lord.

R/. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ. The leader prays with hands joined: God of every nation and people, from the very beginning of creation you have made manifest your love:

when our need for a Savior was great

you sent your Son to be born of the Virgin Mary.

To our lives he brings joy and peace, justice, mercy, and love.

Lord

bless all who look upon this manger; may it remind us of the humble birth of Jesus, and raise our thoughts to him,

who is God-with-us and Savior of all,

and who lives and reigns forever and ever. R/. Amen.

AUDACITY

There is a spirit of audacity in our readings today. During a time of injustice and threat of invasion, the prophet Micah boldly announces that the God of insignificant Israel will raise up a leader from backwater Bethlehem, and this leader will bring justice and peace to the whole world. In the Gospel, Elizabeth and Mary, marginalized women, brazenly celebrate that their sons will be world-changing instruments of God. We further learn that this audacity is rooted in trust in God. The author of Hebrews describes the faithful obedience of Jesus. Mary is shown as the exemplar of faithful trust in God. This is the way God often seems to work, in the ordinary and marginalized in our world. Those who seem weak have learned to trust in God's strength. These have the audacity to become instruments of God's peace and justice.
