#### FROM THE PASTOR



If there is anything that people would universally agree upon today, it's that the world is continually changing. There is change at every level of society and within every aspect of creation. We experience it often, and sometimes we even like what change brings. As hard as we might try, we cannot avoid change. Understanding this is one of the difficult lessons of life.

One of the changes the western world has been experiencing for decades is a decline in the number of people choosing to be Christian. Catholicism has experienced this, but not to the same extent as other Christian denominations. The decline in our numbers has been felt in many ways. There are fewer people at Mass on Sunday mornings, fewer children in our schools, and fewer priests.

The fewer number of priests has required the Priests Personnel Board and Bishop Thomas to be more creative in assigning priests to parishes. First, parishes in Toledo that have become smaller in recent years will soon be twinned just as all the other parishes in our deanery are twinned. Secondly, they are looking to give newly ordained priests more time as "vicar" priests before being assigned as pastors. However, this will require a decrease in the number of priests serving as pastors throughout our Diocese.

Some very recent changes in the number of available priests in our Diocese have accelerated the timeline of when these proposed changes need to occur. As a result, there is a "strong possibility" that the three Catholic parishes here in the Mansfield area will collectively be assigned three priests with one of them being the pastor of all three parishes. At this point it seems that Bishop Thomas would appoint me as pastor of the three parishes. Fr. Matt Frisbee has demonstrated strong spiritual and pastoral leadership at St. Mary and Resurrection parishes. As a result, he would be reassigned to other parishes in our diocese this summer and replaced by a newly ordained or foreign priest.

All indications are that if this change doesn't happen this summer, it will eventually. It's important to remember that each parish would function and operate as they do now, except that one team of priests would serve all three parishes. Such an arrangement would provide opportunities and challenges for both priests and parishioners. The person most affected by this would be me, the pastor. All of my life experiences would be needed to make a tri-parish arrangement functional and effective. I'm expecting the Diocese will make their decision about this within the next 4-6 weeks.

Please include this potential change as part of your 30 minutes of daily prayer. Pray that those having the burden of making these decisions will seek the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Pray also for those who will struggle with these potential changes. In your prayer, be sure to thank God for the many, many blessings we have all received from Him. Taking the time to thank God and being grateful can have a bigger positive effect on your life than you may realize.



Fr. Kevin led a Eucharistic Procession from the church to the gazebo at Central Park. The group heard from several speakers and joined in prayer and song before returning to the church.








#### **RICHLAND COUNTY SPELLING BEE**



# PRAYER AND DISCERNMENT GATHERINGS FOR OUR DIOCESAN PREPARATORY PHASE: "FOR A SYNODAL CHURCH"

As you may know we have begun the Diocesan Preparatory phase for the Worldwide Synod on Synodality to take place in Rome in 2023. We have recently begun our prayer and discernment gatherings which are open to all and we encourage you to attend the meeting nearest to you. The remaining dates are:

- Feb. 3rd at St. Anthony parish in Milan
- Feb. 10th at St. Mary's parish in Tiffin

All meetings begin with prayer at 6:30pm followed by time for discernment and conversation. St. Mary's in Tiffin will also host an afternoon meeting beginning at 2:00pm in addition to their evening meeting.

We realize that some may not be able or choose not to attend the gatherings because of the current situation of the lingering pandemic. We would still appreciate your prayer, discernment and feedback as we compile results to forward to the USCCB, who in turn will forward all responses to the Holy See. You may choose to participate online by going to **reconnecttoledo.org** and clicking on the Synodality link at the top of the page. Please take time to watch the videos and participate in the prayer before filling out the survey. You will find the same questions at this site that are being discussed at the "in person" diocesan prayer and discernment gatherings. The online link is currently available. It will close on March 1st, 2022.

We thank you in advance for taking the time to participate and in providing information so that together we may do our part to respond through the USCCB to the Holy See for the upcoming 2023 Worldwide Synod.







#### PRAYER OF THE WEEK

Grant us, Lord our God, that we may honor you with all our mind, and love everyone in truth of heart.

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.



#### TO BE A PROPHET

Today's readings show us what it is like to be a prophet. As Jeremiah recounts his call, God warns him that he will need strength and perseverance to withstand the hostility he will face from "Judah's kings and princes" and "its priests and people" (Jeremiah 1:18b). God also assures him that they "will not prevail over you, for I am with you" (1:19). The psalm reflects both of these struggles as well as deliverance from them ("salvation").

This is exactly what Jesus experiences in today's Gospel. After he claims that his own mission is the same as what Isaiah proclaimed, at first the people marvel at his "gracious words" (Luke 4:22). Soon, however, they become suspicious, skeptical, and hostile, even threatening to kill him. But just as God promised to deliver Jeremiah, so Jesus "passed through the midst of them and went away" (4:30). Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.


