

FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

Thanks again to everyone who helped to prepare the Church for Holy Week, or assisted with the Liturgies, or sang in the choirs, and to the altar servers for their help. Your efforts and contributions are greatly appreciated by me and the

parishioners. Sharing your God given gifts and talents with the parish in this way allows us to tangibly experience our faith in a much greater way. May God bless you abundantly in this life, but even more so in eternity!

The Easter Vigil last weekend was a very special evening as it always is. The evening is unmistakably spiritual and beautiful. One of the special moments that evening was when five people entered the Catholic Church and became the newest members of our parish. Each of them received one or more of the Sacraments of Initiation, which are Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Communion. Baptism is the "gateway" to all the other sacraments and is how a person becomes Christian. We should pray for them that their lives as Christians will be strengthened.

Four people that evening received all three Sacraments of Initiation: Riley Lambert, Skylar Pitzen, Beth Behrendsen, and Alesha Lee. One other person, Dee Troyer, had been previously baptized as Christian but wanted to enter into "full communion" with the Catholic Church. People like her come into the Church from many different Christian denominations. They appreciate all the good of their own denominations, but see there is something extra in the Catholic Faith. For some it is the sacraments, others it is the moral code of the Catholic Church, and still others it is the fact that Jesus only established one Church. Congratulations to all of them!

As we continue to remember and celebrate the sacred events of this past Holy Week, our prayer is that the Easter blessings will move each of us to greater faith in God and faithfulness to His teachings and commandments. It is not uncommon after Easter to lose some or even all of the spiritual progress we made during Lent. We can avert this by continuing throughout the year some of what we were doing during Lent. This will help prevent laziness and weakness in fighting temptations. God directs us to prayer, fasting, and almsgiving throughout the year, not just during Lent.

This Sunday is Divine Mercy Sunday and I invite you to a special Holy Hour today at 3pm in the Church. This special hour of prayer is not the product of human thinking, but given to us by Jesus himself. It was less than one hundred years ago that Jesus instructed St. Faustina about Divine Mercy. Jesus said: "The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy." Please consider the appeal of our Savior and join us for this beautiful hour of prayer.

This year's audit examined the audit period of July 1, 2018 through September 30, 2021. Bishop Daniel Thomas is pleased to announce that the Diocese was found to be in full compliance with the requirements in the Charter following the audit.



ORIGIN OF DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY, THE DIVINE MERCY IMAGE, THE CHAPLET AND THE NOVENA.

Saint Faustina: Mankind's need for the message of Divine Mercy took on dire urgency in the 20th Century, when civilization began to experience an "eclipse of the sense of God" and, therefore to lose the understanding of the sanctity and inherent dignity of human life. In the 1930s, Jesus chose a humble Polish nun, St. Maria Faustina Kowalska, to receive private revelations concerning Divine Mercy that were recorded in her Diary. St. John Paul II explains:

This was precisely the time when those ideologies of evil, nazism and communism, were taking shape. Sister Faustina became the herald of the one message capable of off-setting the evil of those ideologies, that fact that God is mercy-the truth of the merciful Christ. And for this reason, when I was called to the See of Peter, I felt impelled to pass on those experiences of a fellow Pole that deserve a place in the treasury of the universal Church.

-Pope Saint John Paul II, Memory and Identity (2005)

Divine Mercy Sunday: St. Faustina's Diary records 14 occasions when Jesus requested that a Feast of Mercy (Divine Mercy Sunday) be observed, for example:

My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the Fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins

Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment Let no soul fear to draw near to Me It's My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter, Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy. (Diary, no. 699)

On May 5, 2000, five days after the canonization of St. Faustina, the Vatican decreed that the Second Sunday of Easter would henceforth be known as Divine Mercy Sunday.

The Image: Jesus appeared to St. Faustina in a vision, with his right hand raised in a blessing and his left touching his garment above his heart. Red and white rays emanate from his heart, symbolizing the blood and water that was poured out for our salvation and our sanctification. The Lord requested that "Jesus, I trust in You" be inscribed under his image. Jesus asked that his image be painted and venerated throughout the world: "I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish" (Diary, no. 48) and "By means of this image I will grant many graces to souls" (Diary, no. 742).

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy: The Chaplet was also given to St. Faustina with this promise: "Encourage souls to say the chaplet which I have given you" (Diary, no. 1541). "Whoeverwill recite it will receive great mercy at the hour of death Even if there were a sinner most hardened, if he were to recite this chaplet only once, he would receive grace from My infinite mercy. I desire that the whole world know My infinite mercy" (Diary, no. 687). (Instructions for its recitation are provided on a separate page.)

The Divine Mercy Novena: Jesus gave St. Faustina nine intentions for which to pray the Chaplet beginning on Good Friday and ending on the Saturday before Divine Mercy Sunday.
