FROM THE PASTOR



As you likely already know, on July 1, I will be taking on the role of pastor at St. Marv and Resurrection in addition to St. Peter's. With the addition of Fr. Kishore, we will still have three priests serving the Mansfield and Lexington Catholic faithful.

As you will see to the left, the Mass schedules for all three parishes are

included in our bulletin. The location for each Mass will be designated with a single letter - M for St. Mary, P for St. Peter, and **R** for Resurrection.

There are no plans to change weekend Mass times. Each priest will be responsible for saying three Masses each weekend. If one priest were on vacation or fell ill, we would still have two priests available to say Mass at each parish.

At St. Peter, there will be no changes to the weekday Mass schedule. However, there are changes to St. Mary and Resurrection weekday Masses. The schedule is below:

I hope the benefit of publishing the full schedule will encourage you to attend Mass at St. Mary or Resurrection if it is more convenient for you.

Now that the schedule has been finalized, you can call the parish office and schedule Mass intentions for the rest of the year.

We still have some work to do regarding secular holidays, Holy Days of Obligation, and Masses at area nursing homes. My goal is to have those schedules finalized in the coming weeks.

This fall, we will further study the weekend Mass schedules to see if any adjustments need to be made. This process will include input from all three parishes.

Please keep me in your prayers as I take on these new responsibilities as pastor, and pray that God provides us with a clear vision as we move forward as three individual parishes, but one Catholic community of faith.

### **DISCIPLESHIP'S COSTS**

In today's first reading, God tells the prophet Elijah to prepare Elisha to succeed him. Succeeding Elijah will be no easy task; he has spent his life facing threats from the kings he has confronted about their infidelity to the God of Israel. The psalm illustrates the emotional and spiritual distress that the prophets' steadfast faithfulness to God brought them. Paul's description of the Christian's freedom from the law as opposed to "the desire of the flesh" puts this struggle at the very heart of Christian identity. The reading from Luke's Gospel recounts Jesus' decision to journey toward Jerusalem, where he knows he will meet his earthly fate. Following Jesus-like succeeding Elijah as prophet—will now become more difficult. Unlike his calls to the first disciples, Jesus encounters those who are not ready or are not strong enough to journey with him.
